



Tips for Supporting Participants

Need to apply for a Social Security number (SSN) and card or obtain a replacement card? You may be able to complete or start an application on the Social Security

Administration website. You can use their online scheduling tool to book an appointment at a local office.

For a New SSN Number or Card:

You'll answer a series of questions to determine whether you can:

- Complete the application process online
- Start the application process online, then bring any required documents to your local Social Security office to complete the application, typically in less time
- Complete the application process at your local office
