Founded in 2009, Restore NYC is a nonprofit organization with a mission to make freedom real for survivors of trafficking. In 2024, Restore celebrated 15 years of providing long-term, survivor-informed solutions that go beyond crisis response to support healing, safety, and independence.

Restore's work is **anchored in three core programs: Client Services, Economic Empowerment, and Housing**. These programs offer comprehensive support, including case management, trauma-informed counseling, job readiness and placement, and housing services. Through its Housing Program, Restore provides a continuum of options tailored to the unique needs of survivors of trafficking—ranging from emergency shelter through hotel partnerships, to transitional housing for up to 18 months, and independent living support via rapid rehousing and flexible funding.

Restore was first awarded HUD funding through the FY 2023 CoC Program for its Rapid Rehousing for Survivors of Trafficking initiative, with a renewal awarded in the FY 2024 cycle. **Restore is proud to be the first trafficking-specific organization to receive HUD funding in NYC**—marking a significant milestone in expanding housing solutions for this underserved population.

### NYC Built 34,000 New Homes in 2024

Last year, almost 34,000 new homes were completed in New York City, the most units in a single year since 1965. More than a 6,000 increase in housing units from last year, driven by a surge of permits filed in 2022 before the 421-a tax incentive expired. <u>The Department of City</u> <u>Planning</u> recently updated its Housing Database with new tools highlighting housing production across the city, revealing that Brooklyn had the highest number of newly constructed units of all the boroughs.

### New Bronx Building With 64 High-Quality Homes Opened

In March, a new 64-unit site with affordable housing in the Bronx opened through the Affordable Housing Service program, where the city offers nonprofit developers a steady stream of tenants who can pay rent using city housing vouchers. This site will prioritize women-led households, the first Affordable Housing Services (AHS) site to specifically prioritize renting units to women-led households.

# Using Data to Prevent the Loss of Home Equity in New York City

A new report coproduced by the NYU Furman Center and the Urban Institute's Housing Justice team levarages a mix of public and proprietary data in efforts of preventing unnecessary losses of home equity, specifically among

households less equipped to navigate legal and financial complexities. Rising property values, aging owners, and incomplete property records create conditions that leave some homeowners vulnerable to exploitation.

A new study "<u>Success Rates in the Housing Choice Voucher</u> <u>Program: 2018-2022</u> released by the <u>NYU Furman</u> <u>Center</u> demonstrates the feasibility of using national administrative data provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to calculate success rates for housing choice voucher recipients.
