# 2019 Housing Inventory Count - Point in Time (HIC-PIT)

The annual Housing Inventory Count (HIC) and Point in Time (PIT) is due by Tuesday, April 30, 2019. The report is in the final weeks of preparation for submission of the housing inventory and demographic count that identifies NYC's homeless community. The HMIS team at DSS continues to work on data collection activities that will ensure every bed/unit that is dedicated to homeless individuals and families is counted.

### FY 2018 Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) NOFA

HUD released the FY 2018 Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) with the deadline for submissions on Wednesday, May 15, 2019. The YHDP will be awarded to 25 communities, 8 rural and 17 urban for a total of \$75,000,000. The population to be served by this demonstration program is youth experiencing homelessness, including unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth, where no member of the household is older than 24. The application will be written in collaboration with the CoC Youth Committee, City Agencies and the Youth Action Board. Communities that receive the award will incorporate those funds as part of the larger NOFA process and projects will then be renewed under the CoC.

## FY 2019 New Project Request for Proposals

The 2019 CoC NOFA competition is expected to be released in May of this year. Organizations interested in HUD funding for new permanent housing

projects are encouraged to apply for funding and will be asked to respond to the 2019 CCoC New Project RFP. The CCoC will release a New Project Request for Proposals (RFP's) to the community soon. Reallocated funds are used to fund new projects under the NOFA. The CCoC also encourages organizations to voluntarily reallocate some or all of their grant if underspending is an issue.

If your organization intends to reallocate any funds you must formally notify the CCoC by letter no later than 5 days after the release of the NOFA. Organizations wishing to return a whole grant please notify the CCoC cochairs right away.

# 2019 System Performance Measures (SPM)

HUD recently released a <u>national</u> <u>summary of the System Performance</u> <u>Measures (SPM)</u> that reflects CoC submissions from 2015 - 2017. This summary includes a printable report and a link to a data visualization site that allows CoCs to customize a view of the data for their local analysis purposes.
