The initial NYC CAPS Policy & Procedure Manual was approved by the NYC CCoC Steering Committee in January 2018. CAPS development is an iterative process, relying on the existing network of committed advocates, shelters, drop in centers, street outreach teams, housing providers, government agencies, tenants of HUD funded housing, and applicants to inform, guide and evaluate CAPS.
