Provider Spotlight: Special NOFO Edition

This month the CoC would like to spotlight **Breaking Ground**, who was recently awarded funding from HUD's <u>Special NOFO</u> for two projects: Project Welcome MAT (Moving on an Accelerated Timeline) and Project IN-Reach (Integrating harm Reduction and Increasing Care Coordination).

Breaking Ground was founded in 1990, by a small group of people coming together to bring to scale a new model of housing for people who were experiencing or at risk of homelessness - permanent supportive housing. The result was Breaking Ground's Times Square residence. Take a tour of <u>Breaking Ground's website</u> to learn more!

Project Welcome MAT's central objective is to reduce the amount of time between a Breaking Ground (BG) client's acceptance into BG permanent supportive housing and their actual move-in thereby narrowing the gap between a "paperwork first" approach to housing and a true Housing First approach.

Project IN-Reach's goal is to integrate Harm Reduction (HR) services and robust care coordination practices

into our street homeless outreach services, building on a pilot project seeking to reduce unsheltered deaths in a particular area where the outreach teams had seen large increases in past years. Project IN-Reach builds on this by turning additional attention to the risk that opioid use and other forms of substance use pose to folks who are unsheltered.
