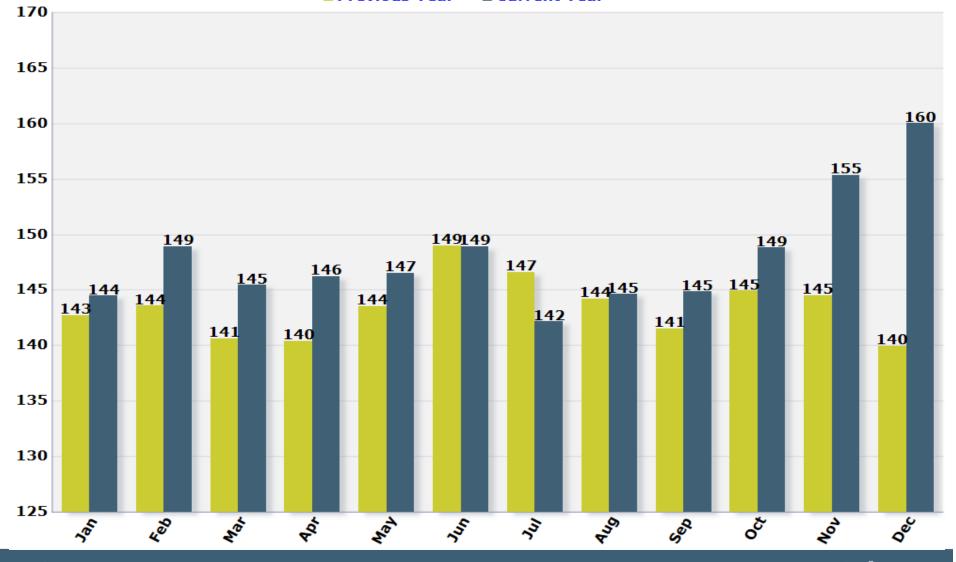
The Key Performance Indicator (KPI) report tracks NYCHA's performance in three main areas:

- Customer Satisfaction (Residents satisfied with repairs)





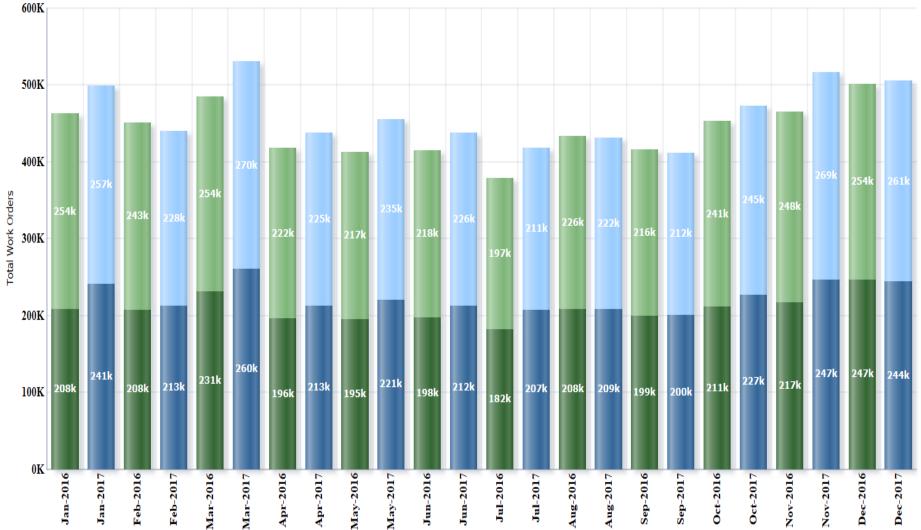
Open Work Orders (in thousands)





Work Orders (in thousands)

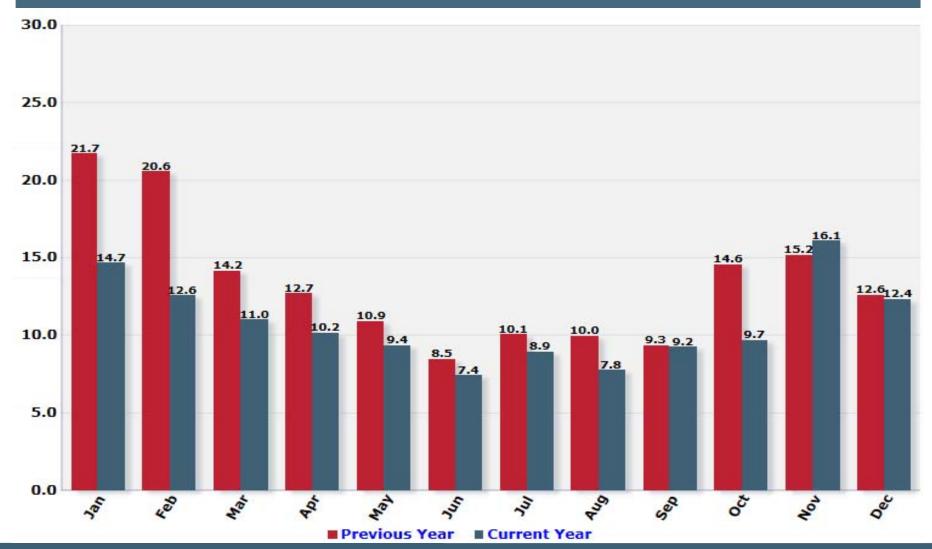

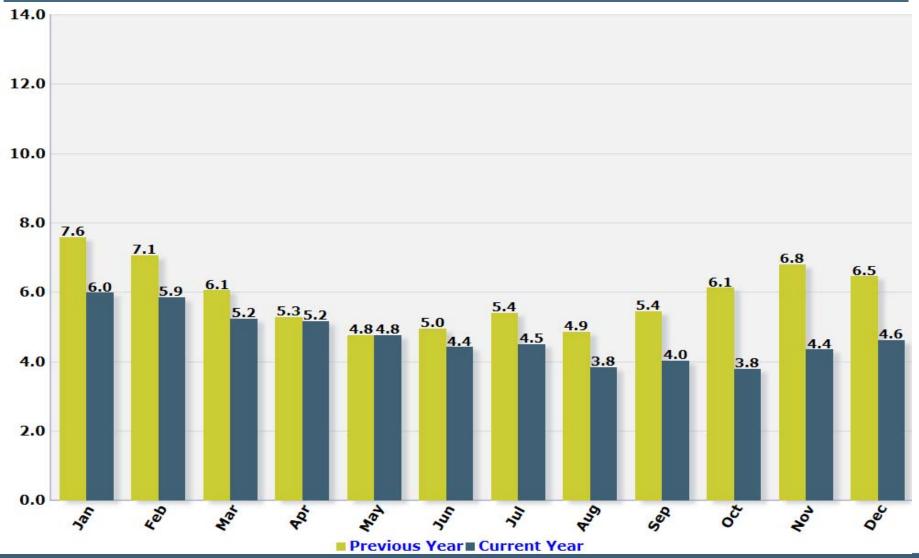
Emergency Work Orders (in Hours)





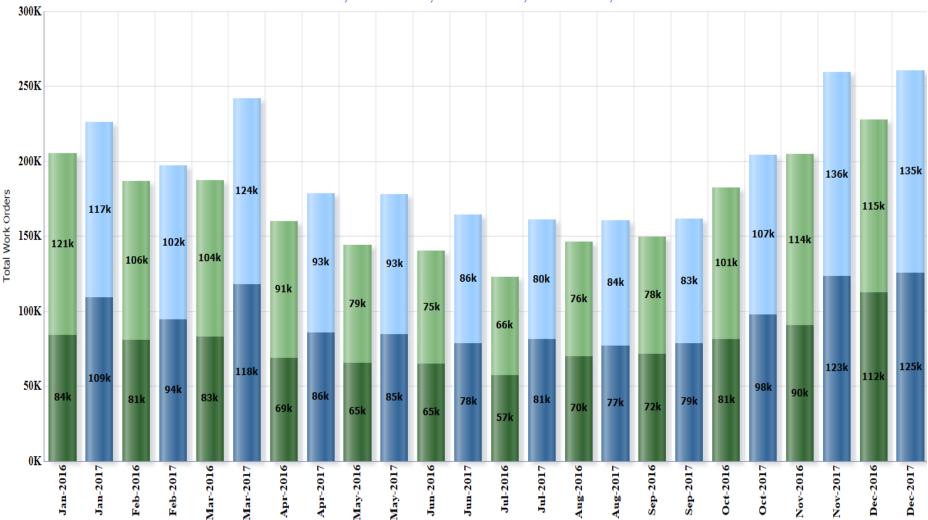


Maintenance Work Orders (in Days)





Skilled Trades Work Orders (in thousands)

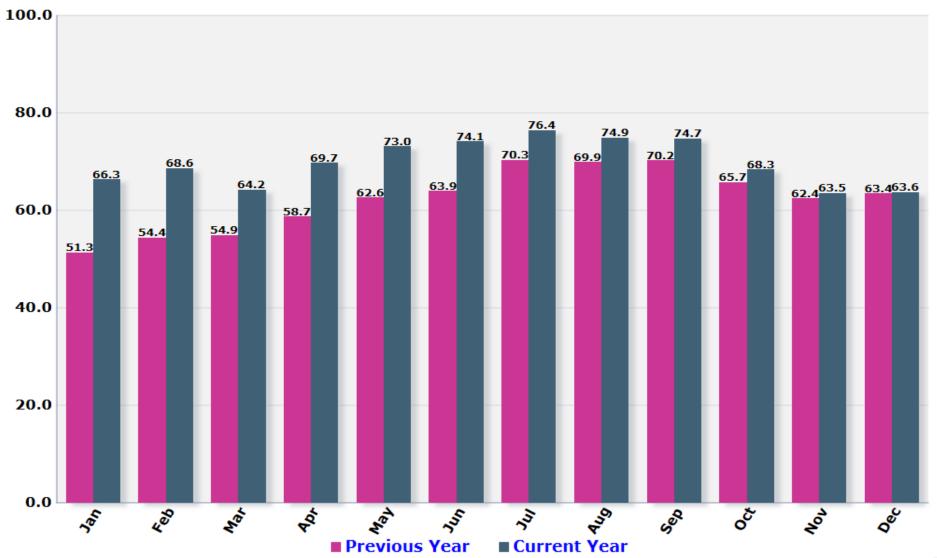


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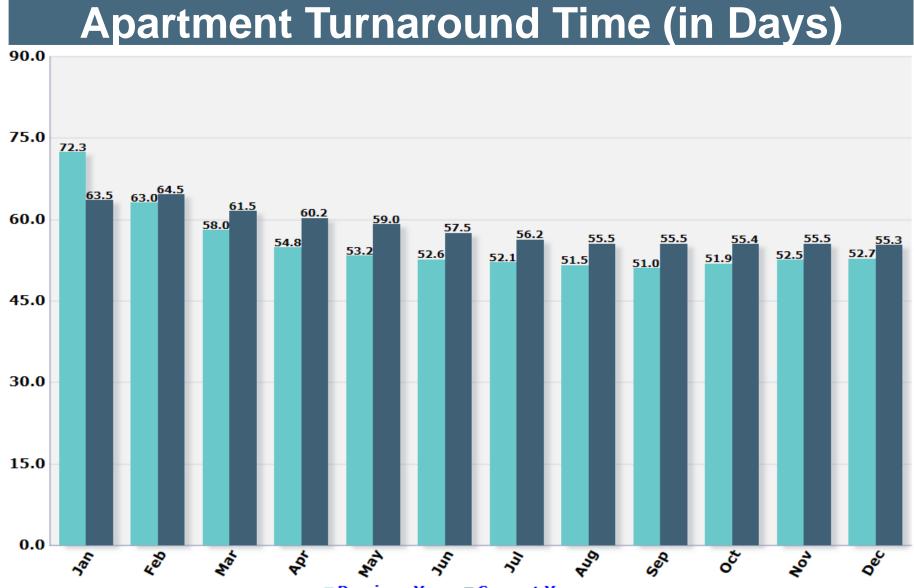

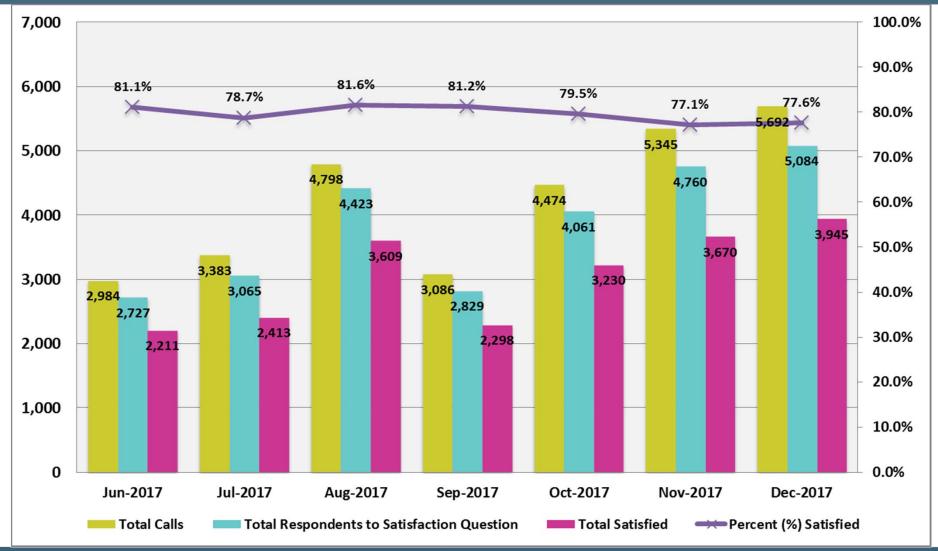
