

### **CY 2019 Proposed Operating Plan:** Funding Highlights

In 2019, the proposed Operating Plan makes much-needed investments in health and safety, including:

- \$110 million to support testing and remediation of lead hazards.
   XRF testing of 135,000 apartments will begin in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2019.
- \$35 million to expand NYCHA Cares, the Mayor's successful initiative to address backlogged work orders.
- \$21 million to purchase 5 mobile boilers and replace system components prone to failure across 70 developments.
- \$12 million to address the causes of rodent and other pest infestations at targeted developments.
- \$2 million in increased staffing resources for Compliance and Internal Audit to improve accountability.

## **CY 2019 - 2023 Proposed Capital Plan:** Funding Highlights

\*The proposed five-year Capital Plan makes significant investments to fund improvements to NYCHA developments, including:

- \$991 million to replace 290 boilers.
- \$220 million to support the replacement of 404 elevators in 29 developments.
- \$663 million to repair 600 roofs at 59 developments.
- \$451 million to upgrade kitchens and bathrooms in 8,250 apartments.
- \$95 million to repair façades and bring buildings into compliance with Local Law 11.

\*The proposed CY 2019-2023 Capital Plan indicates capital items to be <u>funded</u> over five years, whereas NYCHA 2.0 indicates capital items to be <u>completed</u> within five years.
