

NEW YORK CITY WATER BOARD

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to Section 1045-j (3) of Title II-A of the New York Public Authorities Law, that the New York City Water Board (the “Board”) held a public hearing by teleconference on May 24, 2022 and held its annual meeting by teleconference on June 6, 2022, at which the Board adopted a resolution approving an increase in the rates charged for water provided to customers located north of New York City. The following rate changes, found in Part II, Section 4 of the Board’s Rate Schedule, are effective as of July 1, 2022:

The regulated rate for water supply provided to customers located north of the City within the allowance quantities set forth in Section 24-360 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, increased from \$2,054.63 per million gallons (“MG”) to \$2,083.48 per MG; and

The rate for water supply provided to users outside the City that is in excess of the allowance quantities set forth in Section 24-360 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York increased from \$5,355.07 per MG to \$5,617.46 per MG.

The Rate Schedule also included a clarification that the calculation of late charges on overdue billed amounts owed by customers outside of New York City who receive water supply from either the Croton or Catskill and Delaware systems corresponds to the highest prevailing interest rate applicable to overdue billed amounts owed by the Board’s customers located in the City of New York.
