







Total Population by Nativity New York City, 1970 to 2012




Foreign-Born by World Area of Origin New York City, 1970-2012







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











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Poverty Rate by Neighborhood Tabulation Area* New York City, 2008-2012





Persons with Ratio of Income to Poverty Level of 1.00 to 1.99 by Neighborhood Tabulation Area* New York City, 2008-2012






Distribution of Population without Health Insurance Coverage By Nativity and Citizenship Status New York City, 2012






Foreign-born Population without Health Insurance Coverage By World Area of Birth New York City, 2011

Foreign-born Population without Health Insurance Coverage By Place of Birth New York City, 2011









Data from the 2000 Census offer detailed information on New York City, enabling users to paint statistical portraits in a number of ways. Information is presented in the following sections:

Profiles of Census characteristics provide a large number of data items for various geographic areas. For example, the Socioeconomic Profiles provide six pages of characteristics that include high school graduates, median family income, and percent below poverty, as part of a profile that is displayed separately for each Community District.

Tables of Census characteristics provide detailed information on a single topic at various geographic levels. For example, detailed data on all income categories for persons in all 59 Community Districts is presented in a single table.

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
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

The 2010 census provides a demographic portrait of New York City's population. This includes data on age, sex, race and Hispanic origin, household size and type, living arrangements and relationships of household members, and housing units by occupancy status (occupied, vacant) and tenure (owner, renter). These data are presented for a variety of geographic areas, including the city, five boroughs, community districts, neighborhood tabulation areas (NTA), and census tracts.

These data are available in tabular format in the section labeled Demographic Tables, while maps are presented in the section Demographic Maps; analyses are provided under Census Briefs. In addition, a Census Challenge section includes information on New York City's challenge of the 2010 Census results, through the Count Question Resolution (CQR) program. The first of these challenges provides detailed information on why New Yorkers were likely missed in two sections of Brooklyn and Queens due to the misclassification of housing units as vacant.

Introduction
The U.S. Census Bureau prepares estimates of total population for all counties in the United States on an annual basis, using a demographic procedure known as the "administrative records method" (described below). This method assumes that post-census population change can be closely approximated by vital statistics data on births and deaths, along with other administrative and survey data that provide a picture of migration patterns.

Census Bureau Estimates for July 1, 2013

Total Population

According to Census Bureau population estimates, New York City's population increased from 8,175,133¹ in April of 2010 to 8,405,837 in July of 2013. This is an increase of 230,704 residents or about 2.8 percent over the 2010 mark. The largest change in the city's population occurred in Brooklyn, growing by 3.5 percent or 87,400 persons, followed by Queens (2.9 percent or 65,453 persons), Manhattan (2.5 percent or 40,286 persons), and the Bronx (2.4 percent or 33,625 persons). Staten Island (0.8 percent or 3,891 persons) showed the smallest gains over the 39 month period.

New York City's population increase since April of 2010 represented 84.5 percent of the total increase in New York State, which slightly raised the city's share of the State's population, from 42.2 percent to 42.8 percent.



New York City Population Projections by Age/Sex & Borough, 2010-2040







Appendix Figure 3: Age-Specific Migration Rates by Borough, 1990-2010











Share of School-age and 65+ Population, NYC 1950-2040


Figure 5: Share of School-age and 65+ Population, New York City, 1950-2040



Employment Projections 2010-2040



Percent of Residents 16-64 years in the Labor Force by Neighborhood Tabulation Area* New York City, 2008-2012


