NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING AND PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD  
PROPOSED 2022 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN**

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, COMMUNITY BOARDS, GROUPS, AND PERSONS:

In accordance with 24 CFR 91.105 of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Consolidated Plan regulations regarding citizen participation, the Mayor's Office of Operations, along with the agencies responsible for implementing the City of New York's *Annual Action Plan* have scheduled a:

**Virtual Hearing on Wednesday, July 20<sup>th</sup> 2022 from 2:00-3:00pm for the Proposed 2022 Annual Action Plan.**

**The 30-day Public Comment Period on the Proposed 2022 Annual Action Plan is Friday, July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 – Saturday, July 30<sup>h</sup>, 2022.**

The Proposed *Annual Action Plan* is required by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). It consolidates the statutory requirements of the Cranston-Gonzalez Housing Act's Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy, and the City's annual application for the four HUD Office of Community Planning and Development's entitlement programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships, Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).

The Proposed Action Plan serves not only as the City's application for the funds, but also as the HOPWA grant application for the New York HOPWA Eligible Metropolitan Statistical Area (HOPWA EMSA). Beginning in Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2022, the HOPWA EMSA will be comprised of the five boroughs of the City of New York plus three upstate New York counties (Westchester, Rockland and Putnam).

For the 2022 Program Year, the City received \$304,212,902 in entitlement funds for the four HUD formula grant programs: \$166,259,543 for CDBG; \$81,327,120 for HOME; \$41,777,058 for HOPWA; and \$14,849,181 for ESG.

The Public Hearing has been scheduled to obtain comments on the proposed plan and the City's use of federal funds to address housing, services for the homeless, supportive housing service and community development needs, affirmatively further fair housing, and the development of proposed activities.
