| Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law     | Agency employee inadvertently disclosed a document containing identifying information of one client to another client.               |

| Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law     | Agency employee inadvertently disclosed client identifying information to another client and a state employee.                       |
| Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law     | Agency employee inadvertently emailed a document containing identifying information to another city agency.                          |
