Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (10)	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (9)	Agency employee improperly sent an electronic message containing identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency employee inadvertently emailed client identifying information to more recipients than was intended.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (3)	Agency employee inadvertently emailed a document containing client identifying information to another agency.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (2)	Agency employee inadvertently emailed client identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law (2)	Agency employee inadvertently mailed a document containing client identifying information to a member of the public.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor experienced a security incident resulting in disclosures of identifying information to a third party.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee's laptop containing identifying information was stolen.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee disclosed identifying information to a media outlet.

Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor inadvertently disclosed identifying information due to a technical error.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently left a laptop containing identifying information in a residential building.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently emailed a document containing identifying information to opposing counsel.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee disposed of documents containing identifying information before shredding them.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Contractor disposed of documents containing identifying information before shredding them.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee inadvertently emailed identifying information to an employee at another city agency and opposing counsel.
Disclosure in Violation of the Identifying Information Law	Agency employee improperly disclosed identifying information to another city agency.
