IN THE MATTER OF an application submitted by TSG Coney Island Entertainment Holdco, LLC pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter for an amendment to the City Map involving:

1. the elimination, discontinuance, and closing of Bowery between Stillwell Avenue and West 12th Street,
2. the establishment of new grades on a portion of Stillwell Avenue between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way,
3. the elimination, discontinuance, and closing of a volume within Stillwell Avenue between Bowery and Wonder Wheel Way,
4. the elimination, discontinuance, and closing of a volume within West 12th Street between Surf Avenue and Bowery, and
5. the modification of block dimensions and grades necessitated thereby

including authorization for any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto, in accordance with Map No. X-2775, dated December 16, 2024 and revised March 19, 2025, and Y-2776 dated December 16, 2024, revised March 19, 2025 and May 7, 2025, and corrected May 16, 2025, and signed by Borough President.

This application (C 250108 MMK) for an amendment to the City Map was filed by TSG Coney Island Entertainment Holdco, LLC on November 14, 2024. The proposed amendment to the City Map would facilitate the development of a new 1.4 million gross square-foot, mixed-use development including a gaming facility, hotel, convention center, parking, and other amenities in the Coney Island neighborhood of Brooklyn, Community District 13.

BACKGROUND

TSG Coney Island Entertainment Holdco, LLC is proposing an amendment to the City Map to demap portions of streets to facilitate the development of a gaming facility within the Coney East Subdistrict of the Special Coney Island District. The proposed development would include a new gaming facility and entertainment complex with approximately a 354,400 square foot casino;

248,900 square foot hotel; 109,400 square foot convention center; 54,600 square feet of general retail; 20,360 square foot food hall; 48,200 square feet of event space; 101,500 square feet of open rooftop space; 475,890 square feet of parking for 1,500 parking spaces; and a total floor area of approximately 1,323,500 square feet with a floor area ratio (FAR) of 5.8. The proposed land use action, in conjunction with the recently adopted Gaming Facility Text Amendment (N240179ZRY), would allow the New York State Gaming Facility Location Board to consider an application by TSG Coney Island Entertainment Holdco LLC to develop a gaming facility on the development site.

The Coney Island area, originally used for farming and cattle pastures, has a long and storied history as an amusement, recreation, and resort destination that began in the mid-1800s. By the late 19th century, there were over ten hotels, several large restaurants and ballrooms, theaters, a casino, bathhouses, horse racetracks, and the first mechanical amusements, which included the first carousel and roller coaster in the nation. In 1903, the Luna Park amusement area opened and one year later, the fourth amusement park known as Dreamland opened. In 1920, the Wonder Wheel Ferris wheel opened, followed by five new roller coaster rides including the Cyclone. The wooden plank Riegelmann Boardwalk first opened along the Coney waterfront in 1923 and now stretches to 2.7 miles in length. The Wonder Wheel, the Cyclone, and the Riegelmann Boardwalk are designated New York City landmarks.

Coney Island remained a popular amusement destination in the 1930s despite the impacts of the 1929 stock market crash and the Great Depression, and was home to 60 bathhouses, 13 carousels, 11 roller coasters, 200 restaurants, and over 500 small, independent businesses. Post-World War II, many of these businesses and amusements would eventually close, whether due to fire, bankruptcy, or general disrepair. The city, through Robert Moses and the federal urban renewal program, began to clear certain neighborhoods for the development of large residential buildings.

In 2009, the City rezoned an area of Coney Island and established the Coney Island Special District with the goal of creating a 27-acre amusement and entertainment district that would reestablish Coney Island as a year-round, open and accessible amusement destination (N 090272

(A) ZRK). The special district created four subdistricts: (1) the Coney East subdistrict, intended as the amusement and entertainment core; (2) the Coney North subdistrict, intended for residential, hotel, and retail uses; (3) the Coney West subdistrict, intended for residential and retail uses including entertainment and amusement uses along a revitalized Boardwalk; and (4) the Mermaid Avenue subdistrict, intended for residential development and neighborhood retail uses.

The existing land uses within the surrounding area fall predominantly into three categories: open space and outdoor recreation uses, commercial uses, and residential use. South of Surf Avenue, open space and outdoor recreation uses are located both on privately owned land and City-owned property under the jurisdiction of the New York City Economic Development Corporation (EDC) and the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR). Maimonides Park, which is home to the Brooklyn Cyclones 7,000-seat baseball stadium, the Luna Park and Deno's Wonder Wheel Amusement Parks, Riegelmann Boardwalk, Coney Island Beach, and the New York Aquarium all operate on mapped parkland. Commercial uses, both within the mapped parkland and within the privately owned property, can also be found south of Surf Avenue, and include a variety of eating and drinking establishments, amusement uses, and retail. North of Surf Avenue, within the surrounding area, are commercial uses, mixed-uses, and residential buildings ranging in height from one to 24 stories. There are several significant neighborhood features, resources, and amenities in the area, including Nathan's Famous, Asser Levy Park to the east, and the Abe Stark Sports Center and the Coney Island Amphitheater located to the west.

Zoning districts within the area, south of Surf Avenue, include the Coney East Subdistrict, which is located in a C7 zoning district, and parkland which include Maimonides Park, Luna Park and Deno's Wonder Wheel Amusement Park, Riegelmann Boardwalk, Coney Island Beach and the New York Aquarium. North of Surf Avenue, zoning districts include a small portion of the Coney North Subdistrict, located in a R7X zoning district with a C2-4 overlay and modified by the Subdistrict, a portion of the Coney East Subdistrict, located in a C7 zoning district, and an R6 zoning district which is located outside the Special Coney Island District.

The Coney East Subdistrict of the Special Coney Island District is the amusement and entertainment core of the Coney Island neighborhood. As such, the existing built conditions and land uses located in the proposed development site are predominantly amusement and entertainment in nature: there is a go-kart track, mini golf, various other arcade and amusement stands, rollercoasters, eating and drinking establishments, food and beverage stalls, amusement related retail and more general retail, outdoor art installations and an art gallery, to name a few. While there are a number of one- and two-story buildings, many existing structures are temporary and located on otherwise vacant land. The site is located within the C7 zoning district, which is modified by the Coney East Subdistrict within the Special Coney Island District. The Subdistrict modifies the underlying allowable uses, location and size of certain uses, floor area and bulk regulations, and signage and parking regulations to facilitate the goals of the Subdistrict as a pedestrian-oriented amusement and entertainment district.

The site is also located within the Greater Transit Zone, a FRESH Zone, and a Coastal Zone and Flood Zone pursuant to 2007 and 2015 Flood Insurance Rate Maps.

The Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue MTA subway station serving the D, F, N, and Q lines terminates directly across from the development site on Surf Avenue. The B36 bus runs along Surf Avenue, Avenue Z, and Nostrand Avenue, and connects Coney Island and Sheepshead Bay. The B64 bus runs from Bay Ridge to Coney Island stopping at the Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue subway terminal across from the proposed development as does the B68 connecting to Windsor Terrace/Park Slope to Coney Island and the B82 bus, which runs to Starrett City and East New York. John F. Kennedy International Airport is 14 miles to the east of the proposed development site.

The proposed development site is generally bounded by Surf Avenue to the north, West 15th Street to the west, Jones Walk (a previously demapped street) to the east, and Wonder Wheel Way to the south. The development site has approximately 430 feet of frontage along Surf Avenue, 505 feet of frontage along West 12th Street, 155 feet of frontage along Jones Walk, 485 feet of frontage along Wonder Wheel Way, 650 feet of frontage along Stillwell Avenue, 260 feet

of frontage along West 15th Street, and 385 feet of frontage along Bowery Street, with a total lot area of approximately 227,311 square feet or 5.2 acres.

Gaming in New York

The New York State Gaming Commission regulates all aspects of gaming activity in the State, including horse racing, pari-mutuel wagering, Class III Indian Gaming, the state lottery (including video lottery terminals), commercial gaming, sports wagering, interactive fantasy sports, and charitable gaming. In 2013, New York State voters approved a referendum to allow the state legislature to authorize up to seven new commercial casinos for the purposes of promoting job growth, increasing aid to schools, and investing in mass transit through revenues generated. Four gaming licenses have subsequently been awarded in the upstate New York region.

In 2022, the state legislature passed legislation authorizing up to three licenses for gaming in downstate New York, including New York City, Long Island, and Westchester, Putnam, and Rockland counties. The State created a process to review applications for the licenses which includes the review and approval by a local Community Advisory Committee (CAC) that will be convened for each individual application based on the location of the proposed gaming facility. Each proposed gaming application will have a public review and open meetings and hearings process that is led by a CAC that will consist of the following six members or their representative: New York State Governor, New York City Mayor, New York State Assemblymember, New York State Senator, Borough President, and New York City Council member. If an application is approved by a two-thirds majority of the CAC, the application will be forwarded for review and approval by the State. In addition, the State can only consider an application that has presented evidence that the gaming facility is in compliance or has received approval with all required local zoning requirements. The applicant, TG Coney Island Entertainment Holdco, LLC, has stated that if they are not awarded one of the gaming facility licenses, then they would not pursue the proposed development.

On April 18, 2024, the City Council adopted a zoning text amendment referred to as the Gaming Facility Text Amendment. This text amendment is intended to facilitate the state-led process,

avoid duplicative reviews, and provide an even playing field among city sites. Before the text amendment was adopted, the Zoning Resolution did not permit the gaming facility use in any zoning district. The text amendment allows a gaming facility as a permitted use in C4 through C8 commercial districts and manufacturing districts if operating under a gaming license issued by the New York State Gaming Commission. It further provides that a gaming facility, as licensed by the Gaming Commission, shall be deemed to have satisfied all applicable regulations of the Zoning Resolution.

The Proposed Project

The proposed development would provide a new, year-round destination and entertainment complex that would contain an approximately 353,400 square foot casino, 248,870 square foot hotel, 109,370 square foot convention center, 54,640 square feet of general retail, 20,360 square foot food hall, 48,200 square feet of event space, 101,500 square feet of open rooftop space, 475,900 square feet of parking for 1,500 parking spaces, for a total floor area of approximately 1,323,500 square feet (5.8 FAR) on the proposed development site.

The proposed development site would be comprised of four tax blocks that would be connected by two bridges to be built within the proposed demapped volumes of air: one bridge over Stillwell Avenue and the other over West 12th Street. The four tax blocks include:

- a. Development Site 1: Tax Block 7074, Lots 256, 310, and 360;
- b. Development Site 2: Tax Block 8694, Lots 1, 5, 11, 12, 14, 25, 33, 30, 414, 419;
- c. Development Site 3: Tax Block 8695, Lots 61, 64, 72, and 433; and
- d. Development Site 4: Tax Block 8696, Lots 35, 37, 44, 47, 48, 49, and 50.

Development Site 1 would be the westernmost building located between West 15th Street, Stillwell Avenue, Bowery Street, and Wonder Wheel Way. The predominant uses in this building include gaming, parking, and a rooftop open space. West 15th Street also serves as the main bus drop-off/pick-up location with a bus turnaround inside Development Site 1.

Development Site 2 and Development Site 3 are the central buildings in the project and would be built on top of the demapped Bowery Street and located between Stillwell Avenue, West 15th

Street, Surf Avenue, and Wonder Wheel Way. Bowery Street is approximately 37 feet wide. The predominant uses in these buildings are also the gaming use, parking, and the rooftop open space. This central building would also serve as the main vehicular entrance for drop-offs, pick-ups, valet parking, and self-parking. All vehicles would enter the development via West 12th Street which is a narrow street at 60 feet wide. For hire vehicles and taxis could leave via West 12th Street while all vehicles driving into the facility to park would exit by driving over the proposed bridge within the demapped volume of air over Stillwell Avenue and exit from West 15th Street. This demapped volume of air over Stillwell Avenue would have a cubic volume of approximately 902,265 cubic feet, with a length of 95 feet, a lower limiting plane of 58.1 feet, and an upper limiting plane of 154 feet². The proposed elevation of the lowest level of the Stillwell Bridge from the street grade level is 48 feet and within the demapped volume of air, the applicant is proposing three floors at 70 feet in height or about 118 feet above grade.

Development Site 4 would be the easternmost building located between West 15th Street, Jones Walk, Surf Avenue, and Bowery Street. The predominant uses in this building include the hotel, convention center, and gaming. Development Site 4 connects to Development Site 2 and 3 via the proposed bridge within the demapped volume over West 12th Street. This demapped volume of air over West 12th Street would have a cubic volume of approximately 884,096 cubic feet with a length of approximately 102 feet³, a lower limiting plane of 34 feet, and an upper limiting plane of 194 feet. The proposed elevation of the lowest level of the West 12th Street bridge from the street grade level is 26 feet and within the demapped volume of air, the applicant is proposing five floors at 134 feet in height or 160 feet above grade.

A portion of the development site would be used to widen West 12th Street to create an additional lane, for a total of four traffic lanes, which would feed into the internal vehicle circulation path generally coinciding with the demapped portion of Bowery Street between West 12th Street and Stillwell Avenue. A total of 1,500 parking spaces would be provided within the proposed development. Loading berths would be accessed from West 15th Street, West 12th Street, and Bowery Street.

The casino use would be located across the entire development. The main pedestrian entrance into the proposed development would be located at the southeast corner of Surf Avenue and Stillwell Avenue, across the street from the Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue MTA subway station. A separate hotel and convention center entrance would be located on West 12th Street, just south of Surf Avenue, and can also be accessed through the main entrance in the central buildings. There would be a variety of retail and eating and drinking establishments across the development and accessible from the surrounding streets. Additionally, the interior of the proposed development would allow for enclosed pedestrian circulation to access all uses, including the retail and eating and drinking establishments, throughout the year. A separate entrance to the rooftop open space that is accessible to the public from Stillwell Avenue near Wonder Wheel Way would be available for the public who do not wish to enter inside the proposed development.

Stillwell Avenue, between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way, would be pedestrianized and transformed into a 100-foot-wide thoroughfare called Stillwell Walk that would serve as a gateway entrance into the area. Stillwell Walk would be lined with greenery, seating, and other public amenities. In conjunction with the pedestrianization of Stillwell Avenue, a grade change would be made to provide an improved pedestrian experience and help alleviate a portion of the ongoing flooding in this area as a result of rising sea levels.

Proposed Actions

In order to facilitate the proposed development, the applicant seeks a City Map Amendment to:

- eliminate a portion of Bowery Street between West 12th Street and Stillwell Avenue;
- eliminate, discontinue and close a volume of air over a portion of West 12th Street between Bowery Street and Surf Avenue;
- eliminate, discontinue and close a volume of air over a portion of Stillwell Avenue between Wonder Wheel Way and Bowery Street; and,

- change the grade of a portion of Stillwell Avenue between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way.

The portion of Bowery Street proposed to be eliminated is between West 12th Street and Stillwell Avenue (Block 8694; Lots 419, 1, 33, 30, 25 and Block 8695; Lots 433, 61, 64). Bowery Street is not a City-owned street. The volumes of air to be eliminated, discontinued and closed are City-owned would be sold to the applicant.

The volume of air above West 12th Street proposed to be demapped begins at a lower limiting plane of approximately 34 feet in elevation (25 feet above grade) and rises to an upper limiting plane of approximately 194 feet in elevation. The volume of air starts at a point on the eastern side of West 12th Street that is approximately 83 feet south of Surf Avenue, then running south for approximately 102 feet, then spanning the width of West 12th Street, to a point on the western side of West 12th Street 198 feet north of Wonder Wheel Way, then running north for approximately 105 feet, to a point which is approximately 100 feet south of Surf Avenue, then spanning the width of West 12th Street to the point of beginning. This volume of air is City-owned and is proposed to be purchased by the applicant.

The volume of air above Stillwell Avenue proposed to be demapped begins at a lower limiting plane of approximately 58 feet in elevation (48 feet above grade) and rises to an upper limiting plane of approximately 154 feet. The volume of air begins at a point on the western side of Stillwell Avenue that is approximately 66 feet north of Wonder Wheel Way, then running north for approximately 95 feet, then spanning the width of Stillwell Avenue to a point on the eastern side of Stillwell Avenue to a point approximately 261 feet south of Surf Avenue, then running south for approximately 93 feet, to a point which is approximately 87 feet north of Wonder Wheel Way, then spanning the width of Stillwell Avenue to the point of beginning. This volume of air is City-owned and is proposed to be purchased by the applicant.

The portion of Stillwell Avenue proposed to be elevated is located between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way. The existing grade of 4.76 feet on Stillwell Avenue where it intersects with Surf Avenue would be elevated to 5.0 feet; the existing grade of 8.0 feet on Stillwell Avenue where it intersects with Bowery Street would be elevated to 9.0 feet; the midblock grade between

Bowery and Wonder Wheel Way will be elevated to 10.6 feet and 13 feet⁴; and the existing grade of 9.6 feet on Stillwell where it intersects with Wonder Wheel Way would remain unchanged.

If the applicant is not awarded a gaming facility license, the alteration maps for the City Map change described above would not be filed pursuant to Section 198c of the City Charter, and the proposed City Map amendment (C 250108 MMK) would not take effect.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 250108 MMK) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 *et seq.* and the New York City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The designated CEQR number is 24DCP129K. The lead is the City Planning Commission.

It was determined that this application, in conjunction with the related action, may have a significant effect on the environment, and that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) would be required. A Positive Declaration was issued on May 17, 2024, and subsequently distributed, published and filed. Together with the Positive Declaration, a Draft Scope of Work for the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) was issued on May 17, 2024. A public scoping meeting was held on June 17, 2024. A Final Scope of Work was issued on December 13, 2024.

A DEIS was prepared and a Notice of Completion for the DEIS was issued on December 13, 2024. Pursuant to SEQRA regulations and the CEQR procedure, a joint public hearing was held on the DEIS on March 19, 2025, in conjunction with the public hearing on the related ULURP item (C 250108 MMK). A Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) reflecting comments made during the public review process was completed, and a Notice of Completion for the FEIS was issued on April 25, 2025.

The proposed project, as analyzed in the FEIS, identified significant adverse impacts with respect to historic and cultural resources, transportation, and construction transportation. Significant adverse impacts related to hazardous materials and noise would be avoided through requirements in the project approvals, such as the mapping agreement. In addition, the application contained Project Components Related to the Environment (PCREs) related to traffic which are set forth in Chapter 12 “Transportation” of the FEIS. The proposed mitigation measures are detailed in Chapter 19, “Mitigation” of the FEIS.

WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

This application (C 250108 MMK) was reviewed by the City Coastal Commission for consistency with the policies of the New York City Waterfront Revitalization Program (WRP), as amended, approved by the New York City Council on October 30, 2013 and by the New York State Department of State on February 3, 2016, pursuant to the New York State Waterfront Revitalization and Coastal Resources Act of 1981, (New York State Executive Law, Section 910 et seq.). The designated WRP number is 23-219.

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 250108 MMK) was duly referred on certified on December 16, 2024, to Brooklyn Community Board 13 and to the Brooklyn Borough President for information and review in accordance with the procedures for ULURP matters.

Community Board Review

Community Board 13 voted against approving the City Map application by a vote of 11-24-8. The Community Board resolution, including a number of attachments, are at the end of this report.

Borough President Recommendation

The Brooklyn Borough President issued a recommendation on March 14, 2025, to approve the proposed mapping action with the following public benefit conditions:

“The applicant must prepare and evaluate alternative development scenario(s) where:

- The skybridges proposed on Stillwell and 12th are programmed for only for pedestrian circulation, and not an extension of gaming facility, building program, or related uses, including vehicular circulation and/or parking.
- The volumes to be demapped are reduced, particularly by increasing the height of the lower height-limiting plane, and limiting the overall bulk to ensure visibility through the site.
- The number of parking spaces is substantially reduced. Savings incurred by a reduced cost of construction should be reallocated to the Community Trust Fund.
- Additional ground level amenities are provided, including open spaces and pedestrianized streets.
- The entirety of any newly created rooftop amenity space is made accessible to the public. The current proposal apportions roughly half of its rooftop space to public use.
- Consider a scenario that only demaps Bowery.

The applicant must also commit to:

- A letter from the Applicant Team that spells out in writing all Community Benefit terms that were discussed during the ULURP process, as well as new conditions as cited by the Borough President, City Planning Commission, City Council, and CAC
- Fund capital improvements in the six Coney Island NYCHA developments, which, as of NYCHA's latest capital assessment, total \$1.7B
- A Community Advisory Board that will meet regularly and act as a watchdog for all promised community benefits
- Flood resilience throughout the site and evacuation plans for emergency events
- A commitment to investment in Luna Playground
- A significant commitment to fund local transportation improvements and connections, including but not limited to:
 - Improvements to the MTA's Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue station complex,
 - Renovation of the Coney Island maintenance yard
 - Bus priority infrastructure on Surf Avenue

- Streetscape improvements such as curb bumpouts, pedestrian islands, mid-block crossings, and expansion of protected bike lanes
 - Including a new landing in Coney Island for the expansion of the Ferry
- A disclosure of the anticipated annual revenue across the gaming facility and all its ancillary uses
- As Queens BP Donovan Richards stated in his recommendation for Queens Futures:
 - with regard to gambling addiction awareness and education, the Applicant must adhere to all advertising guidelines set forth by the New York State Gaming Commission; and they must supply a list of community-based organizations you are partnering with on gambling addiction awareness education
 - Workforce development plan that includes (but is not limited to) the following: 30% MWBE Hiring Goal (with the intention of exceeding said goal); the total projected number of jobs, both permanent and temporary; list of community-based organizations with which the Applicant has signed MOUs for workforce development; local hiring reporting quarterly to the Community Board, Borough President, and Council Member; and culturally competent outreach to street vendors for space at the proposed food hall as well as any appropriate passive space on the Proposed Development
- An access plan to ensure community members will not be policed out of public spaces
- A framework for some of the Proposed Development's revenue to be earmarked for improvements in Coney Island, such as investments in Riegelmann Boardwalk and the southern terminus of Ocean Parkway.”

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On March 5, 2025 (Calendar No. 6), the City Planning Commission scheduled March 19, 2025, for a public hearing on this application (C 250108 MMK). The hearing was duly held on March 19, 2025 (Calendar No. 26). There were 20 speakers in favor of the application and 11 in opposition.

The applicant team, consisting of eight members, spoke in favor of the application. The first speaker was the applicant's architect who described the overall project and noted that it is rooted

in the history of Coney Island and the entertainment, amusements, and gaming uses. The applicant's land use attorney discussed the proposed public transportation improvements and vehicular circulation including how the proposed bridge over Stillwell Avenue will allow the free flow of pedestrians on the pedestrianized Stillwell Walk. Furthermore, the attorney spoke of how the main vehicular entrance into the development is from West 12th Street and into the centrally located buildings: hotel and convention center users would cross over the West 12th Street bridge from the central building and into the hotel. They also noted how the development would have a local hiring preference and create over 4,000 permanent union jobs. Another applicant representative highlighted that the proposed development would be active year-round and not just in the warmer months.

Those testifying in favor of the application included the Brooklyn Chamber of Commerce, NYCHA residents, neighborhood residents, a former city council member, and small business owners. The testimony in favor of the application highlighted the possible economic and job opportunities that could benefit the neighborhood residents and the people of Coney Island. Many speakers highlighted the lack of investment, jobs, and restaurants in the area and noted that the development could be a catalyst for change.

Those testifying against the application were all current or former residents of Coney Island and from the neighboring communities. Their testimony focused on how a casino would change the fundamental character of Coney Island, the negative social impacts of the gaming use, and the exacerbation of the existing traffic problems that the development would bring to the area.

In addition to the testimony heard at the hearing, the Commission also received over 150 written comments from individuals and organizations regarding the proposal. Most of the written testimony was in opposition to the application.

CONSIDERATION

The City Planning Commission believes that this application for a City Map change (C 250108 MMK), as modified herein, is appropriate.

The Coney Development, if awarded a gaming license from the State Gaming Commission, will build a new 1.3 million square foot entertainment and commercial complex that includes a 354,400 square foot casino; a 248,900 square foot hotel; a 109,400 square foot convention center; 54,600 square feet of general retail; a 20,360 square foot food hall; 48,200 square feet of event space; 101,500 square feet of open rooftop space; and 475,890 square feet of parking for up to 1,500 parking spaces.

Coney Island has a unique and celebrated history as an entertainment and amusement destination and includes the most visited beach in New York City, with 44 million visitors between 2017 and 2024 according to NYC Parks data. While the area is still active and full of people going on rides and to the beach during the summer months, it is not a year-round destination. The Commission believes that the proposed new gaming facility, that is facilitated by this mapping action, could provide much-needed year-round economic development and new employment opportunities that benefit the Coney Island community and the entire city. Casinos were once a popular and established use in Coney Island and a gaming facility returning to Coney will not only reinforce the area as an amusement district but also establish a new, year-round destination for residents and tourists, aligned with the goals of the Special Coney Island District.

The mapping action will facilitate the development of two skybridges over Stillwell Avenue and West 12th Street and a floorplate that spans existing mapped Bowery Street. The Commission notes that Stillwell Avenue is a prominent gateway to Coney Island's iconic amusement area, and links the nearest subway station, which serves the D, N, F, and Q lines at Stillwell Avenue and Surf Avenue, to the amusement area and beach. West 12th Street is a north-south secondary connector that contributes to addressing pedestrian circulation needs to the amusement uses and beach, which draw large volumes of foot-traffic. The street bed beneath the requested demapping volumes will need to continue to play an important role in this regional amusement destination's street grid.

The Commission believes that the 100-foot-wide Stillwell Avenue has the potential to be transformed from a standard, vehicle-centered city street to a pedestrianized entrance with amenities and landscaping leading into the Coney Island amusement area and Riegelmann

boardwalk. This entrance is intended to act as a gateway and is also suitably located directly across the street from the Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue MTA subway station which will encourage public transit access to the development. The bridge over Stillwell Walk within the demapped volume of air will connect the gaming facility buildings above grade and allow all vehicles that will be parking in the development to bypass the new Stillwell Walk and reduce all conflicts with motor vehicles.

The Commission notes that emergency vehicles will still have access to this section of Stillwell Avenue that will be pedestrianized and that the off-street parking facilities will be open to Coney Island residents.

The Commission believes that the proposed grade change along the pedestrianization section of Stillwell Avenue is appropriate. The grade change of Stillwell Walk, and the attendant design features, will signal to all users that this is a unique entrance with a distinct identity and one that will create an improved experience for those going to the casino or going to the beach. The Commission appreciates that the grade change is also intended to be a response to flood mitigation needs given the project's location in the high-risk 1%-annual-chance floodplain. The Commission notes that any future street improvements in this area should also consider future flood risk and contribute to addressing the flooding and stormwater management within the general vicinity of the Coney Development.

The Commission believes that the approximately 50-foot clearance under the bridge over Stillwell Avenue is sufficient to preserve the gateway function of that street. However, the proposed, lower clearance of approximately 24 feet for the bridge over West 12th Street would create a dark and forbidding streetscape for pedestrians travelling from Surf Avenue to the amusement areas and the beach to the south. The Commission therefore modifies the proposed application to raise the lower limiting plane for the volume over West 12th Street from an elevation of 33.65 feet to an elevation of 50 feet (creating a clearance of approximately 41 feet). This is a nominal improvement to the contemplated scale of the bridge and resultant condition in the public realm. The modification will raise the vertical clearance of the bridge improving the width-to-height proportion of the street and the tunnel-like sightlines it would have created. The

modification will also make the clearance under the West 12th Street bridge more closely aligned to the clearance under the Stillwell Avenue bridge.

The Commission recognizes that skybridges passing over city streets should only be available under very limited circumstances and should not negatively impact the public realm and the active city street life. The Commission notes that this approval will only become effective if the project is granted a gaming license by the New York State Gaming Facility, and that additional substantive public and technical review is necessary before that occurs. Therefore, there is value in demapping a volume of air that will optimize design flexibility during those future review processes. The Commission believes that both bridges could be further sculpted and scaled back during the required future review process later this year when the complete gaming development application is submitted to the State and under review. Furthermore, the Commission strongly recommends that the skybridges be reduced to the minimum dimensions necessary to facilitate only essential programmatic connections across buildings to ensure that the streetscape conditions beneath the bridges remain an open and inviting environment with generous clearances and maximized access to natural light. The Commission believes strategies such as reducing the depth of the skybridges and providing setbacks can help lessen the impacts on the public realm and preserve the important link between the City and its premier beach and amusement destination. The Commission also encourages the applicant to incorporate strategies that further mitigate the scale of the proposed skybridges through creative use of lighting, materiality, and facade design.

The Commission notes that the subject of this report is the approval of the proposed City Map change and that these approvals do not approve or disapprove the proposed Coney Development gaming application. The State designated a six-member Community Advisory Committee to review and vote on each gaming application based on the location of the proposal. The Commission believes that the CACs are crucial for the review of each gaming application as they will represent local elected officials. The CACs will hold public meetings and solicit feedback and input from local communities and key stakeholders. In order for the State to consider a gaming application, the application must have all necessary local zoning and planning approvals in place which includes this mapping action.

The Commission acknowledges that the proposed City Map change is intended only to enable the applicant to apply for a gaming facility license. Therefore, the Commission restricts this approval of the proposed City Map Amendment to take effect only if a license for a gaming facility is granted for this proposal.

RESOLUTION

Therefore, the City Planning Commission, deeming the proposed amendment to the City Map and any related acquisition or disposition of property to be appropriate, adopts the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that having considered the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) for which a Notice of Completion was issued on April 25, 2025, with respect to this application (CEQR No. 24DCP129K) the City Planning Commission finds that the requirements of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act and Regulations have been met and that:

- a) The environmental impacts disclosed in the FEIS were evaluated in relation to the social, economic, and other considerations associated with the actions that are set forth in this report; and
- b) Consistent with social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives available, the action is one which avoids or minimizes adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable; and
- c) The adverse environmental impacts disclosed in the FEIS will be minimized or avoided to the greatest extent practicable.

The report of the City Planning Commission, together with the FEIS, issued April 25, 2025, constitutes the written statement of findings that form the basis of the decision pursuant to Section 617.11(d) of the SEQRA regulations; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Planning Commission, in its capacity as the City Coastal Commission, has reviewed the waterfront aspects of this application and finds that the proposed action will not substantially hinder the achievement of any WRP policy and hereby determines that this action is consistent with WRP policies, and be it further

RESOLVED, by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Sections 197-c and 199 of the New York City Charter and Section 5-430 et seq. of the New York City Administrative Code that based on the environmental determination and the consideration described in this report, the application (C 250108 MMK), as modified, for an amendment to the City Map involving:

- the elimination of Bowery between Stillwell Avenue and West 12th Street,
- the establishment of new grades on a portion of Stillwell Avenue between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way,
- the elimination, discontinuance, and closing of a volume within Stillwell Avenue between Bowery and Wonder Wheel Way,
- the elimination, discontinuance, and closing of a volume within West 12th Street between Surf Avenue and Bowery, and
- the modification of block dimensions and grades necessitated thereby

including authorization for any acquisition or disposition of real property related thereto, in accordance with Map No. X-2775, dated December 16, 2024 and revised March 19, 2025, and Map No. Y-2776 dated December 16, 2024, revised March 19, 2025 and May 7, 2025, and corrected May 16, 2025, and signed by the Borough President is hereby approved, and be it further

RESOLVED that, pursuant to Section 5-432 of the New York City Administrative Code, the City Planning Commission determines that “such closing or discontinuance will further the health, safety, pedestrian or vehicular circulation, housing, economic development, or general welfare of the City,” nor shall such closing or discontinuance “substantially interfere with pedestrian or vehicular use of such streets” and be it further

RECOMMENDATION FOR: THE CONEY DEVELOPMENT – C250108MMK

In April 2022, New York State Legislators voted to allow up to three casino licenses in downstate New York, which includes New York City, Long Island, and Westchester. In January 2023, the New York State Gaming Facility Location Board (the Board) released a Request for Applications calling for proposals to build a casino with a minimum capital investment of \$500 million. The Board received nine applications for downstate casinos, including one in Coney Island, Brooklyn. Each proposal will be evaluated by their own Community Advisory Committee (CAC), and the CACs for New York City proposals will consist of six members, one each appointed by the governor, mayor, applicable state senator, applicable state assemblymember, applicable borough president, and applicable city councilmember. The CACs will hold public hearings, solicit written comments, and will issue a finding, by a two-thirds vote, approving or disapproving the proposal. If approved, the proposal will be referred to the Board, who will select up the three licenses for downstate casinos.

This ULURP application does not wholly address the question of whether or not there should be a casino development proposal, as that decision is subject to the CAC and the State's licensing process—the only action considered for this item is a demapping action and the subsequent land use considerations, evaluation of public benefit in exchange for demapping a public street, and identifying needed mitigations that result from environmental impacts that have been identified throughout the review of the application.

Fundamentally, there is a procedural decision that is unfortunately timed in that it happens prior to review by the CAC. What was designed as a process to ensure NYC applicants could be competitive to be awarded a State license has resulted in frustration by community members—it remains unclear where the public can comprehensively evaluate the tradeoffs/merits of the project and if needed, modify the proposal through meaningful public engagement to generate the most public support and address community-identified concerns. This application follows a pattern of a lack of meaningful alternatives to improve public discussion. Rather than develop a range of building alternatives resulting from a diverse range of building programs, volumes to be demapped, and approaches to an integrated building design, the applicant has only presented one alternative. Further, the no-action alternative does not consider a gaming facility use at all, even though an application for such a complex, without the requirement of demapped streets, could have been presented, evaluated, and served as a point of comparison between no action and the proposed discretionary action.

Project Description

The project area spans approximately 5.2 acres across 24 tax lots on portions of four blocks in Coney Island. It also includes a portion of Bowery between West 12th Street and Stillwell Avenue. The applicant is proposing the following modifications:

- Demapping a portion of Bowery between West 12th Street and Stillwell Avenue.
- Demapping a portion of West 12th Street between Bowery and Surf Avenue.
- Demapping and acquiring air rights over Stillwell Avenue between Wonder Wheel Way and Bowery.
- Adjusting the grade of a portion of Stillwell Avenue between Surf Avenue and Wonder Wheel Way.

These changes would enable the construction of two skybridges connecting the four blocks of the proposed development as well as construction atop Bowery.

The project is located in a C7 commercial district within the Coney Island Special District, adjacent to iconic landmarks such as the Wonder Wheel, The Cyclone, and the Coney Island Boardwalk. The Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue Subway Station, which serves the F, D, N, and Q trains, is directly across from the site. The surrounding area consists primarily of one- and two-story buildings and falls within designated flood zones, as identified on FEMA's Flood Insurance Rate Maps.

The development would encompass 1.3 million square feet and include:

- A casino; a 43-story hotel; a convention center; general retail and dining space, including a food hall; event space and open rooftop areas; and 1,500 parking spaces.

The proposals for Stillwell Avenue would create a pedestrian thoroughfare, which the applicant called the “Coney Arch” above Stillwell would leave a 48 feet tall and 100 feet wide walkway underneath, which would be a pedestrianized street except for emergency vehicle access. The demapping of Bowery would facilitate the main vehicle entrance to the site, and acquiring air rights over West 12th Street (from 34 feet to 194 feet) would allow for a pedestrian connection between the hotel/convention center and the casino/parking structure.

According to the Racial Equity Report created by the applicant, the project is expected to create 3,772 new jobs in the Gambling Industry (NAICS 7132), which have an annual median wage of \$25,000.

The applicant is seeking a gaming license from the New York State Gaming Facility Location Board (the Board) in 2025. The project cannot proceed without this license.

Community Board Position

Community Board 13 voted to disapprove the recommendation on January 22, 2025. CB 13 did not outline any conditions, but attached petitions from residents and comments from their Land Use Committee and Full Board hearings to their recommendation regarding the appropriateness of siting a casino in Coney Island.

Borough President ULURP Hearing and Public Comment

The Borough President held a hearing on this item on March 10, 2025. 72 members of the public provided testimony at the hearing, and 4,513 members of the public submitted written comments to AskReynoso@brooklynbp.nyc.gov and 40 members of the public provided written comments to Testimony@brooklynbp.nyc.gov. The Office received additional signed petitions in favor and opposed to the project. Below is a high level summary of the points articulated by both sides.

Testimony in opposition to the application:

- Irreversible harm to Coney Island’s culture and character
- Proximity to families and increased crime concerns
- Traffic congestion and negative impact on accessibility
- Risk of gentrification and displacement
- Potential rise in problem gambling and related social issue

Testimony supporting the application:

- Job creation in high-poverty areas
- Economic revitalization for Coney Island
- Potential community benefits through a Community Benefits Agreement (CBA)
- New recreational opportunities for seniors

Additionally, the Borough President held two community forums in Community District 13 on March 6, 2023, to gather feedback on a potential casino in Coney Island. More than 350 people participated in the two sessions, and the Borough President’s Office received nearly 500 responses total to the three questions posed during the sessions. Approval Rationale

The Borough President does not believe the proposed actions should be precluded from further discussion by the forthcoming CAC that would be created to review this application, should the applicant team submit an application to the Board. The Borough President is committed to collaborating with the applicant, the City Planning Commission, and the City Council to address legitimate concerns raised by community input, environmental review, and the poorly coordinated relationship between ULURP and CAC review. Given the wide spectrum of community perspectives on this proposal, it is critical that the applicant present their best proposal that maximizes public support.

Conditional approval of this demapping action should be interpreted as a procedural action and does not pre-empt the vote of the Borough President's appointment to the CAC. Should the applicant fail to incorporate the conditions outlined below and respond to additional issues identified by the community, the Borough President would not support the proposal at the CAC.

Process Conditions

Independent from the merits and drawbacks of this particular application, Borough President Reynoso remains concerned about the convoluted and opaque procedure for reviewing this application and all new gaming facilities. In the recommendation for the Gaming Facility Text Amendment, the Borough President warned that the Community Advisory Committee (CAC) review process remained far too unclear to waive all applications from undergoing ULURP. Over a year later, this remains true: there are scant details on how many public hearings will be held, what kind of technical review will be conducted, and who will be conducting the technical review.

Throughout that text amendment application process, the Department of City Planning stated that the intent of the Gaming Facility Text Amendment was to put all gaming facility applications on an "equal playing field." This application currently before us shows that no such thing has happened – Brooklyn residents and elected officials are instead being tasked to weigh in on a confusing, unprecedented sequence of public review, where the applicant is applying for a real and specific demapping action, but also cautioned to not take the review too seriously, as the true review period for the support for the gaming facility use will occur later through CAC review. Further still, the applicant is also subject to review on a list of other criteria as evaluated by the Board.

Additionally, the City and State have not adequately explained the mechanism by which a demapping (a non-zoning action) would become moot should the corresponding application for a gaming license not receive CAC or the Board's approval. Throughout this process, the City has attempted to reassure the public that any such application would simply not have its demapping action "filed" or considered complete by the Department of City Planning. In actuality, the mechanism for making this determination relies on the establishment of a "mapping agreement" established between the City and the applicant that would outline conditions for considering the application complete. However, the City's description of this process has resembled more of a promise from the administration to simply not complete a ministerial action that has been ratified by a democratically defined process in the New York City Charter. At a time of unprecedented executive overreach at the federal level, it is reckless and irresponsible for New York City and State to handwave away concerns about the binding nature of approved land use actions by implying that the executive would simply decline to finish paperwork.

Borough President Reynoso echoes his concern from his recommendation for the Gaming Facility Text Amendment and remains unconvinced of the necessity to review this demapping action before CAC review has taken place. The view that the demapping must be approved first relies on a conflation between the CAC

process and the final determination by the Board, which are two different bodies with two different review periods.

In the Request for Applications (RFA) for the current round of licenses, the Board states that they will establish a reasonable amount of time to obtain zoning approval for their proposed projects before being considered by the Board. This reasonable time period could have been provided after CAC review concluded. This is traditionally how significant neighborhood plans and large projects are reviewed. In the example of the Atlantic Avenue Mixed Use Plan, ULURP was the approval mechanism for the plan itself. Community engagement preceded and informed a set of approaches and alternatives that the public at large was able to further refine through feedback and negotiations throughout ULURP. CAC review should have been understood as asking the question, “Does the public support gambling in this area?” and not “What size and shape building should gambling occur in in this area?” These two questions inevitably overlap. The public would have been better served by having the ability to ask these questions in the same forum. Instead, the decision to require ULURP review prior to community review — as the name of the CAC suggests — has resulted in **an unclear process that asks the public and ULURP participants to take an inherently premature, incomplete position on a highly important and sensitive topic.**

As the Borough President outlined in his recommendation in the Gaming Facility Text Amendment, the decision to consolidate land use review into the CAC process was unnecessary and has created confusion. This late in the process, it remains unclear how any land use review conducted during CAC review will affect this proposed demapping. For example, if the CAC decides that the proposed size of the skybridges is too large and wants to reduce width and location of the height-limiting planes of the volumes to be demapped:

- How would those changes be effectuated and codified?
- Would another demapping action be necessary?

The City, State, and Applicant have failed to adequately explain how an approval of this demapping application would affect the ability to further modify the proposal for a casino at this site, including any potential public benefits or mitigations. This proposal is subject to a discretionary land use action. There are alternative development scenarios that would not require this demapping action. The applicant’s failure to provide viable alternatives masks the reality that this application is not essential for the development of a gaming facility but only the development of this specific design.

Procedural Conditions

As such, the Borough President requires the following procedural commitments:

- CPC must articulate an additional mapping condition in the CPC report that describes how any modifications ratified through CAC negotiations and subsequent vote would effectuate material changes to this demapping action.
- City Council commits to calling up this map change for full Council review.

Public Benefit Conditions

At best, ULURP is designed to identify key concerns, topics, and discussions that the applicant must resolve to inform the best possible building design, program, and operation. The applicant’s proposal has identified a street demapping as a potential strategy to establish a large enough floor plate and connect four separate sites in exchange for meaningful public benefits, improved building function, design, and placemaking. Part of the rationale for demapping such sizable volumes is that these larger areas allow for a larger contiguous open space on the roof of the proposed development. The commitment given to the Community Trust Fund, currently proposed at \$200 million, is grossly inadequate relative to the benefits to the applicant. **Without the minimum conditions outlined below, the Borough President is unconvinced this is an adequate tradeoff.**

Public Benefit Conditions

The applicant must prepare and evaluate alternative development scenario(s) where:

- The skybridges proposed on Stillwell and 12th are programmed for only for pedestrian circulation, and not an extension of gaming facility, building program, or related uses, including vehicular circulation and/or parking.
- The volumes to be demapped are reduced, particularly by increasing the height of the lower height-limiting plane, and limiting the overall bulk to ensure visibility through the site.
- The number of parking spaces is substantially reduced. Savings incurred by a reduced cost of construction should be reallocated to the Community Trust Fund.
- Additional ground level amenities are provided, including open spaces and pedestrianized streets.
- The entirety of any newly created rooftop amenity space is made accessible to the public. The current proposal apportions roughly half of its rooftop space to public use.
- Consider a scenario that only demaps Bowery.

The applicant must also commit to:

- A letter from the Applicant Team that spells out in writing all Community Benefit terms that were discussed during the ULURP process, as well as new conditions as cited by the Borough President, City Planning Commission, City Council, and CAC
- Fund capital improvements in the six Coney Island NYCHA developments, which, as of NYCHA's latest capital assessment, total \$1.7B
- A Community Advisory Board that will meet regularly and act as a watchdog for all promised community benefits
- Flood resilience throughout the site and evacuation plans for emergency events
- A commitment to investment in Luna Playground
- A significant commitment to fund local transportation improvements and connections, including but not limited to:
 - Improvements to the MTA's Coney Island-Stillwell Avenue station complex,
 - Renovation of the Coney Island maintenance yard
 - Bus priority infrastructure on Surf Avenue
 - Streetscape improvements such as curb bumpouts, pedestrian islands, mid-block crossings, and expansion of protected bike lanes
 - Including a new landing in Coney Island for the expansion of the Ferry
- A disclosure of the anticipated annual revenue across the gaming facility and all its ancillary uses
- As Queens BP Donovan Richards stated in his recommendation for Queens Futures:
 - with regard to gambling addiction awareness and education, the Applicant must adhere to all advertising guidelines set forth by the New York State Gaming Commission; and they must supply a list of community-based organizations you are partnering with on gambling addiction awareness education
 - Workforce development plan that includes (but is not limited to) the following: 30% MWBE Hiring Goal (with the intention of exceeding said goal); the total projected number of jobs, both permanent and temporary; list of community-based organizations with which the Applicant has signed MOUs for workforce development; local hiring reporting quarterly to the Community Board, Borough President, and Council Member; and culturally competent outreach to street vendors for space at the proposed food hall as well as any appropriate passive space on the Proposed Development
- An access plan to ensure community members will not be policed out of public spaces
- A framework for some of the Proposed Development's revenue to be earmarked for improvements in Coney Island, such as investments in Riegelmann Boardwalk and the southern terminus of Ocean Parkway.

My name is Tricia Vita. I've worked with the Coney Island History Project since 2007, first at our free exhibit center under the Cyclone and since 2011 at Deno's Wonder Wheel.

Here we go again trying to save Coney Island! Thor Equities' horrendous renderings for their multi-block casino project with a hotel over 400 feet tall show a complete takeover of the amusement area. It would overwhelm Coney Island USA, Luna Park and Deno's Wonder Wheel Park and destroy numerous small businesses. The developer is asking to close, or "demap," several public streets for private use which would endanger public safety by increasing traffic congestion and cutting off the beach and boardwalk to emergency vehicles.

In 2009 I attended the City Council vote on the Coney Island rezoning and watched as all council members with the exception of two voted "yes" with Coney's then CM Domenic Recchia. One by one they warmly expressed their support for their pal because it's customary to vote with the local council member. The 2 minute testimonies by me and others at public hearings were irrelevant because of this political buddy system and because big money talks. It makes me understand why people are disillusioned with government. And of course all the electeds and bureaucrats who had a role in the rezoning moved on to other jobs and do not live or work in Coney Island. Now 15 years later, we have to go through this process again so Thor Equities can take more of Coney Island than they got in the rezoning?

Keep in mind that if Thor's proposal to acquire air rights to build sky bridges over streets and a hotel more than twice the height permitted by the existing zoning is approved, this would allow Thor to go ahead with these plans in the future regardless of whether their group wins or loses the casino bid since Thor already owns these lots zoned for high rise hotels. I ask the community board, city agencies, and elected officials to do your job with integrity and vote no on this project.

The study also documented a significant increase 10% rise in violent crime, auto theft, larceny, sex abuse, and bankruptcy, as well as increases in substance abuse, mental illness, and suicide.

What this neighborhood needs is more than employment—we need careers, investments in education, vocational training, and youth programs that provide long-term, sustainable opportunities for our residents. A casino brings short-term gains for a few but long-term harm for many.

A casino would mark the tipping point for GENTRIFICATION in Coney Island. It would open the floodgates for developers and investors, leading to rising rents and living costs. Over time, this will push out those who have called Coney home for generations, replacing us with commercial interests and luxury developments.

A recent incident at Stillwell Avenue, where a woman was set on fire, highlights existing public safety challenges. A casino's added crowds and congestion would worsen these risks, likely leading to increased policing in an already overly policed community.

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Dear Community Board 13,

In response to the proposal to demap streets in the Coney Island area, including Bowery, and to allow the casino's corporate entity access to air rights so that they can build taller buildings than currently permitted, I share the following:

- Demapping the streets would force several beloved small businesses to shut down, which would be a tragic loss for the community. We love our small businesses, and if anything want more of them, not fewer.
- Granting air rights would permit buildings completely out of character and scale for the neighborhood, looming like a grotesque monolith above all else. We should not permit this, and instead we should keep the character of our neighborhood intact.
- A casino would destroy the beautiful, unique culture of Coney Island. Coney Island is like no other place; it combines exciting family entertainment, a rich history that is celebrated by the Coney Island museum, and places where everyone can be themselves without any conformity. We must not allow that to happen.
- The casino would eliminate a large percentage of much-loved rides and entertainment. It would, by design, create a monolithic structure intended to keep people inside, giving their money to the already-rich rather than supporting our local small businesses.
- The casino would drive up rents in the neighborhood, forcing the few small businesses that survive the demapping to close due to affordability. It would also increase property taxes, forcing many local residents out of their homes.
- There is extensive evidence that casinos do irreparable harm to residential neighborhoods. Put them near racetracks, in the desert, perhaps there they could succeed – and even then, most existing casinos have, in the past months and years, taken losses. But to put a casino in a residential neighborhood is to doom residents to higher crime, increased traffic, increased poverty, and many other terrible outcomes. Casinos make most of their money from problem gamblers; they prey on the vulnerable and desperate. That is the last thing we need in our community.

- The casino would also remove activities enjoyed by our local children, and replace them with things children should not be encouraged to do – namely, gambling. When children live somewhere where the primary recreational activity available is gambling, we set them up for failure and a life of poverty.

To be clear, those in the community sharing my perspective are not saying that we want nothing built. We want more small businesses and other additions that would improve the neighborhood – a movie theater, a bowling alley, more affordable restaurants (*not* high-end, luxury restaurants that no one in the community can afford, and not corporate chains), a concert hall. Look to what Industry City has done with its vacant lots – they created spaces for small, local artists, vendors, and food and drink establishments, as well as spaces that can host events like the New York Hot Sauce festival, book fairs, and food festivals. All of these would add to the culture in the neighborhood rather than harming it. All of these would create good jobs. And, all of these offer places that everyone can go and enjoy – which a casino cannot say.

Please, if you truly love this community, say NO to the casino, NO to the demapping, and NO to the request for air rights.

I am firmly against **"The Coney"** interfering in our neighborhood unless the extraordinarily rich entities who want to become our neighbors would agree to an enforceable community benefits agreement (CBA) that would look something like my six point plan I am about to relay to you. I would like **"The Coney"** to agree in an enforceable agreement that includes:

- 1) Funding all Public Schools on the Coney Island Peninsula at the same rate as the closest Charter School to our neighborhood. This means, looking at that Charter School's most recent 990's every year that you are here in order to find out what the total contributions were made to that school. Then we want you to match that exact same amount donation to every school on the Peninsula for as long as you are operating a casino in our neighborhood.

During COVID the YMCA essentially closed down. Paying for membership for anyone who lives here **who wants** to join the YMCA might very well prevent the YMCA from ever closing down again.
- 3) Provide funding to all the Tenant Associations on the peninsula in the amount that both **"The Coney"** and the Tenant Association Leaders agree upon that will enhance the living conditions in all the buildings they represent for as long as the casinos operate in our neighborhood.
- 4) Fund the local libraries on this peninsula so that they can have additional hours and additional technologies that will provide the residents of our community with state of the art library services for as long as the casino operates in our neighborhood.
- 5) Completely fund the Business Improvement District along Mermaid and Surf Avenues so that none of the local merchants have to use any of their hard earned income to improve the street they operate their businesses from. This will be a wonderful gesture for **"The Coney"** to enhance the Merchants of Mermaid and Surf Avenues by not having to have them share any of the cost to create a BID.
- 6) Finally – in the enforceable community benefits agreement that would include all five points above, the CBA must also agree to pay for all legal costs should the residents of this community need to take **"The Coney"** to court for not following through with any items they agree to in the enforceable Community Benefits Agreement.
- 7) A Clarifying point – the neighborhoods of Brighton Beach, Coney Island, and Seagate make up the area that I refer to as "the Peninsula."
- 8) A Final Opinion: I think the Casino owners would be insane not to accept an enforceable community benefits agreement like the one I just outlined above, because I believe it will make this agreement a model for America and likely put you over the top to receive this one license that is truly available.

And to all you bullies, that's right I said **"BULLIES"**, that oppose the Casino, hear me loud and clear: I oppose the casino as you do unless my top six points are put into an enforceable community benefits agreement where the community has a right to go to court with a lawyer paid for by **"The Coney"** should the Casino not honor any of the points agreed to in the enforceable community benefits agreement.

My final thought is a really good suggestion: I suggest bringing in Majora Carter, author of ***Reclaiming Your Community: You Don't Have to Move Out of Your Neighborhood to Live in a Better One***, as a third party that could help negotiate an enforceable community benefits agreement between **"The Coney"** and the Coney Island Community. Ms. Carter helped turn the South Bronx into a better community where she continues to reside to this day. www.majoracartergroup.com 929-382-0007

It is said that three licenses are available but most of us believe Yonkers and Aqueduct will get two of them. Hence, there is really only one license up for grabs. I do believe that you powerful people behind **"The Coney"** have a great chance of getting this one license if you convince the powers that be that you are truly behind our community by agreeing to an enforceable CBA.

Enforceability of Community Benefits Agreements

Community Benefits Agreements (CBAs) have become a powerful tool by community groups in land-use planning, racial equity, and environmental justice, notes author Hannah P. Stephan in *Minnesota Journal of Law & Inequality*. These contracts between community members and developers can address concerns about displacement and allow community members to engage with developers productively. Although not a panacea for equitable development, they're widely recognized as one among many critical legal tools that are generally enforceable in court or legally binding.

But the fine details of contract language matter. CBAs are only as powerful as their capacity to hold developers accountable in reaching goals over time and when **challenged** in court or other legal contexts that might not be foreseen when everybody signs on the dotted line. This article delves into 3 areas in which vague or missing contract language and related structure can weaken enforceability.

Consideration

Whether CBAs are enforceable in court depends on several factors, from the perspective of the community organizations. First, experts have raised consideration as a potential issue. Consideration generally refers to the idea that, for a contract to be valid, the promises must be "bargained for": both parties must exchange promises of performance.

Where the consideration provided by the developer includes "substantive terms," the consideration provided by the community organizations is typically an agreement to not bring a lawsuit preventing the development or disparage the development in a court of law, the community organization may be required to prove, that they are "giving something up."

Successors and Delegation of Duty

What happens when the original developer sells or leases part of the development property? Without specific contractual language, the courts decide whether the agreements within the contract will carry with the land or if the original language was specific to the original developer party to the agreement and therefore no longer enforceable.

Third-Party Beneficiaries

The direct parties to the agreement — the developer and signing community organizations — should have clear standing. But does the entire community — an identified beneficiary — have standing to sue to enforce a CBA?

I am Pat O'Brien (718-570-5134; pat@affcn.org) a resident of the neighborhood of Coney Island and I lives in both walking, and parking, distance from the site being considered for **"The Coney."** I also happen to be a member of CB 13.

I am firmly against **"The Coney"** casino interfering in our neighborhood unless the extraordinarily rich entities who want to become our neighbors would agree to an enforceable Community Trust Fund agreement that would include, in writing, that a portion of the funds from the Community Trust will be spent on these six points below. I would like **"The Coney"** to agree, in writing, as part of an enforceable Community Trust agreement that a portion of the funds will be spent on the following six items:

- 1) Fund all **Public Schools** on the Coney Island Peninsula at the same rate as the closest Charter School to our neighborhood. This means, looking at that Charter School's most recent 990's every year that you are here in order to find out what the total contributions were made to that school. Then we want you to match that exact same amount donation to every school on the Peninsula for as long as you are operating a casino in our neighborhood.
- 2) Provide a paid membership for anyone who lives on the peninsula **who wants** to join the Coney Island **YMCA** for every year that you, the Casino owners, operate in our neighborhood. During COVID the YMCA essentially closed down. Paying for membership for anyone who lives here **who wants** to join the YMCA might very well prevent the YMCA from ever closing down again.
- 3) Provide funding to all the **Tenant Associations** on the peninsula in the amount that both **"The Coney"** and the Tenant Association Leaders agree upon that will enhance the living conditions in all the buildings they represent for as long as the casinos operate in our neighborhood.
- 4) Fund the local **libraries** on this peninsula so that they can have additional hours and additional technologies that will provide the residents of our community with state of the art library services for as long as the casino operates in our neighborhood.
- 5) Completely fund the **Business Improvement District (BID) along Mermaid and Surf Avenues** so that none of the local merchants have to use any of their hard earned income to improve the street they operate their businesses from. This will be a wonderful gesture for **"The Coney"** to enhance the Merchants of Mermaid and Surf Avenues by not having to have them share any of the cost to create a BID.
- 6) Finally – in the enforceable community trust agreement that would include all five points above, the community trust fund must also agree to **pay for all legal costs** should the residents of this community need to take **"The Coney"** to court for not following through with any items they agree to in the enforceable Community Trust Fund agreement.
- 7) A Clarifying point – the neighborhoods of Brighton Beach, Coney Island, and Seagate make up the area that I refer to as "the Peninsula."
- 8) A Final Opinion: It is said that three licenses are available but most of us believe Yonkers and Aqueduct will get two of them. Hence, there is really only one license up for grabs. I do believe that the powerful entities behind **"The Coney"** have a great chance of getting this one license if you convince the licensing powers that be that you are truly behind our community by forcefully advocating for an enforceable Community Trust Fund agreement.

My final thought is just a really good suggestion: I suggest bringing in **Majora Carter**, author of **Reclaiming Your Community: You Don't Have to Move Out of Your Neighborhood to Live in a Better One**, as a third party that could help negotiate an enforceable community trust fund agreement between **"The Coney"** and the Coney Island Community. Ms. Carter helped turn the South Bronx into a better community and she continues to reside in that community to this day. I want you to turn the Coney Island community, my home, into a better community as well. www.majoracartergroup.com 929-382-0007

And to all you bullies that oppose the Casino, that's right I said **"BULLIES"**, hear me loud and clear: I oppose the casino as you do unless my top six points are put into an enforceable Community Trust Fund agreement where the community has a right to go to court with a lawyer, paid for by **the Community Trust Fund** itself, should the Casino not honor any of the points agreed to in this enforceable agreement. Decisions of how to spend some the funds must be made and agreed to in advance.

Hi Barbara,

Thank you kindly. My written comment is below. I can attach as a pdf by request if needed.

"Hello. Thank you for this opportunity to speak. I'd like to offer you, the board, my opinion on this matter as a member of the community. I believe I have experience and expertise that could be of interest to you.

My name is Alexis and I got my master of architecture from the graduate school of architecture and urban design at Pratt Institute. I studied architecture & urban planning for 7 years and have worked in the field since I graduated in 2020.

In school I studied the impact of projects like these on neighborhood economics and in my professional career I've worked with neighborhoods in Manhattan that now have to deal with the ramifications of these type of developments. These projects work well to bring consumers to an area that is not populated and not developed. That is not this neighborhood. That is not this city. You might be tempted to say "but these buildings are run down, the streets are dirty, it's a slum." I'll point you to the urban planning economic theory and studies of Jane Jacobs who fought against large developments in the 1960s in Manhattan. The neighborhoods she protected were considered slums at the time, but with the proper care and attention it turned into what we know as SoHo and Chelsea. These are some of the most wealthy economic zones not only in the city but across the whole east coast. She recognized that there was something special in those streets and that bulldozing them would be easier but lose economic value of what's there.

We have that here with Coney Island. This park was the first in a line of franchises. There are many versions of Luna Parks built in the late 1800s across the whole country, and subsequently there are hundreds of thousands of Americans all over the map with a generational nostalgia for these exact streets. I know because I am one, I grew up in Pittsburgh Pennsylvania and worked my very first job as a teenager at one of those franchise parks. When I moved here for school this neighborhood drew me in for that reason. I want the board feel the weight of that and understand that demapping these streets would be devaluing them and losing that potential to capitalize on what we have. Thank you."

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Coney Island USA, we express our firm opposition to the proposed casino project on Coney Island.

Founded in 1980, Coney Island USA is a not-for-profit arts organization dedicated to the cultural and economic revitalization of the neighborhood. Our mission includes providing unique arts programming, such as the Coney Island Museum and the annual Mermaid Parade, which draws more than half a million visitors and generates significant economic activity for the area.

The proposed casino threatens to undermine the existing amusements and the economy of the entertainment area, jeopardizing both our organization and iconic events like the Mermaid Parade. It is difficult to imagine New York City or State allowing a developer to overshadow events as important as the Thanksgiving Day Parade by building over significant public spaces. Yet that is what the casino developers intend to do by replacing large sections of the Coney Island amusement district.

The developers are requesting a variance to construct over critical streets, including West 12th Street, where our landmarked building is located. This would obstruct access to the beach and boardwalk, essential attractions for visitors. The project includes a 1,500-car parking garage for tour buses right next to our historic building, further threatening its survival. With proposed casino towers reaching 40, 20, and 16 stories, our 1917 landmark building may not withstand the surrounding construction.

The area was rezoned in 2009 to preserve its unique character and promote residential growth. Since then, we've seen the emergence of new attractions, including Luna Park and various restaurants, all now at risk due to the casino proposal. The development could also negatively impact the quality of life for residents, particularly the 6,000 individuals living in the nearby Luna Park Housing Development, potentially forcing them to relocate and harming local businesses.

As an organization pivotal to Coney Island's revitalization, we assert that the casino would not enhance the existing entertainment district. Instead, it would overwhelm the neighborhood, displacing local businesses and residents while monopolizing the local economy. The casino complex would erase Coney Island's unique and historic identity, replacing it with an indistinctive facility that fails to attract visitors.

The project would not contribute positively to the local economy; rather, it would diminish Coney Island's tourist appeal, reducing visitor numbers and lowering tax revenues for the city and state. It threatens to convert one of New York City's most unique neighborhoods into another commonplace casino complex, losing the distinctive charm that draws tourists to the area. Coney Island should remain a playground for all ages, not solely a venue for adult gambling. It is the least suitable location for a licensed casino project.

We call upon local officials to oppose the casino project and ensure that community interests are prioritized. On behalf of the Board of Directors, we reiterate our strong opposition to the casino in Coney Island.

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Mr. Santonas,

I attended, through Zoom, the 1/15/2025 meeting about land use requests for proposed casino. I was gratified by the majority "no" vote (and surprised by the abstain). I hope the full Board follows the Committee's lead at the vote on January 22.

I do have some questions and comments to add to the many strong reasons addressed at the meeting to say "no" to the casino.

1. Will the casino be a 24 hour a day operation? Is there any research on how a 24 hour gambling establishment impacts a community vs one that may close for the evening? While the casino representatives talked about traffic agents, police and EMT - does this staffing reflect casino hours?
2. While the casino representatives talked about their large parking area - they did not say if it is open to the public or just for guests of the hotel/casino. If, as I suspect, it is only for guests - then (despite their push for mass transit) - all the cars expected in the parking lot are just adding to the Coney Island street traffic.
3. An extension of #2 regards the planned Convention Center. How many people do they plan for a convention? Do the casino representatives feel that convention participants will arrive by public transportation? Once again - the proposal is adding cars into the mix, not subtracting them.
4. The casino representatives kept emphasizing how they were going to practically mandate employees take public transportation to work. Yet they also claim that they will do local training and hiring - which, I would hope, would mean that most employees would already be close by. The mandate for employees would not make a really big difference to traffic concerns.

5. A Food Court was mentioned many times, it does not sound, at least to me, as presented by casino representatives, like something that would compete with icons like Nathans and the boardwalk offerings. Yet, I find it hard to believe that the hotel will not have at least one, if not more, restaurants that **would be** competition to local restaurants like Gargiulo's.

I do not live in Coney Island right now, I live in Sheepshead Bay - an area that, I feel will be negatively impacted by the proposed development as people head to the "new" attraction. I fear that ramifications from casino traffic will also negatively impact Sheepshead Bay. However, I did grow up in the Warbasse Houses and have a strong connection to Coney Island and its history. Coney Island has made great strides in maintaining its reputation as a family friendly, children safe place. There are other development ideas/opportunities that would support this growth and support the many new residents of the area. I feel a hotel/casino for adults would not be a good addition. It is hard to quantify how I feel the casino proposal will destroy the feel of the neighborhood. The demapping requests will forever change Coney Island.

As a co-owner of the NYC Landmark and world famous iconic Deno's Wonder Wheel, these comments are based my nearly 60 years' experience hosting tens of millions of visitors to Coney Island and providing them with a safe family entertainment experience. These comments are also based on having been a full-time year-round employer, owner, operator and worker in Coney Island. And a Brooklyn resident.

Safety is a PRIMARY concern.

The proposed de-mapping of The Bowery, Stillwell Avenue, W.12th Street, and W 15th Street will have potentially dangerous consequences because all those streets serve as essential fire lanes, providing necessary vehicular emergency access.

The proposed de-mapping transforms West 12th Street into a short private driveway for the project delivery vehicles and the proposed 1,500-car parking garage.

If allowed to proceed that plan will create a choke point on Surf Avenue at W 12th Street and reduce access to all businesses south of the Bowery including the world-famous Wonder Wheel and new Phoenix Family Roller Coaster.

It will also reduce easy access and visibility of the beach and Boardwalk which are the main natural attractions that have helped Coney Island to remain a major tourist destination for over 100 years. (If it ain't broke, don't fix it - Coney Island is thriving the last 25 years without a casino).

If emergency vehicle access is removed via this de-mapping; How are NY Fire Department ladder trucks supposed to reach people in an emergency?

Deno's Wonder Wheel is the centerpiece of the Coney Island skyline, visible from the Belt Parkway and from the windows of all the airplanes flying in and out of NYC. The proposed 400-foot-tall hotel suggested for W 12th Street, and the surrounding structures will abolish that skyline forever. All sight lines of NYC's most famous beach Boardwalk and Landmark ride will be destroyed.

In addition to the safety, emergency and aesthetic concerns, there are practical maintenance problems that the approval and construction of the casino would create. Every 5-10 years for regular maintenance, Deno's Wonder Wheel must be lifted off from its axle to replace all the bearings and the massive rollers which the structure rotates on. This process is done with a crane and a manlift and access would no longer be possible with the proposed plan for the casino.

The downsides of the proposed plan and demapping are dangerous to the public, harmful to the City, and will cause an economic downturn for the local businesses. It is neither welcome nor is it a good idea for Coney Island.

The current design is unacceptable, unsafe and therefore should not be allowed to go forward.
