 - A draft planning framework should take a fine grained approach, including treatment of corridors versus midblocks; responsive to context and clusters of economic activity. It should also support a mixed-use neighborhood through identifying ways for largest sites to include some amount of non-residential, "maker" space and areas to preserve industrial and commercial uses. And encourage connections and activity to and along the Canal.
