    - 1. Zoom to select desired area -OR- Search by Borough, Block, and Lot (BBL).
    - 2. Click on "Tax Map History" tab under the left panel to locate the most current tax map (ending in "9999").
    - 3. Hover over PDFs to identify the "Map Library" PDF and click to download.

For Projects in the Bronx and Staten Island within:
Special South Richmond Development District (SSRD) Special Hillsides Preservation District (SHPD) Special Natural Area District Projects (SNAD)
Applicants should submit the items listed above, AND:
□ SITE TOPOGRAPHICAL SURVEY (existing conditions) — more information is available at the Bronx and Staten Island Offices. Helpful to have been prepared within the last two years.  ○ Showing existing buildings and all walls, patios, porches, decks, terraces and swimming pools  ○ Indicate the width of the street and street status (including all streets abutting the site)  ○ Show all trees larger than 6" caliper  ○ Showing contour lines at 2' intervals  ○ Calculate (or indicate) the APS as well as all areas greater than 25%
Other Help Items for Projects in High-Density Areas, SSRDs, SHPDs, and SNADS (not required):
Examples of included areas: Midtown and Lower Manhattan; Downtown Brooklyn; Long Island City; R9, R10, or equivalent zoning districts; or specific lower-density areas in Staten Island.
