Chair Evie Hantzopoulos: Meeting called to order at 6:30pm. The Chairwoman welcomed Councilmember Tiffany Caban to provide an end of year update for City Council.

Councilmember Caban - YouTube marker 0:00:30

CM Caban provided updates on the New York City Council's work related to equal and fair pay especially for Black and Brown people; The Safer Sanctuary Act which is her bill adding more protections for immigrants seeking asylum; participatory budgeting; creating a comprehensive plan for zoning.

Presentation - Community Visioning Project - CD 22 - YouTube marker 0:04:30

Tessa Blum, CM Caban's Office - Provided an overview of the project the goal of which are: engage the community on key topics, including housing, land use and zoning, transportation, jobs and industry, open space, resiliency and community amenities to identify strengths, challenges, opportunities and shared goals for the future of District 22 around how we use space in the district. The project will be a resource for the Councilmember, the Community Board, City Agencies, Developers and members of the community when considering decisions about the built environment and neighborhood services in CD 22. Additionally, the project will strengthen conversations about further community planning to ensure it is comprehensive. A more indepth presentation will be given to the board in January or February.

Q&A - YouTube marker 0:11:42

Tom Ryan - Asked to explain why the presentation was made.

Tessa Blum - A quick update on the Community Visioning report the CM will be releasing in a few weeks.

Frank Fredericks - Asked if the report is going to show some trends from previous years such as affordable housing trends.

Tessa Blum - Yes - there is a discussion of where we were, where we are now and where we are going, including things such as rent increases etc. The entire visioning session will be up on the Council's Land Use website in the future.

Christina Chaise - Asked whether there was outreach to the Ravenswood Houses since many of the plans surrounded that area. What plans are there to invest in Astoria Houses and to address the vacant units.

Tessa Blum - Outreach was done within all of CD 22. There were no meetings in Ravenswood Houses. The comprehensive plan is about what can be done with the land. Once that is achieved, investments will be discussed.

Christopher Hanway - Wanted to clarify that the visioning was an information gathering process.

Tessa Blum - This is an information gathering process leading to guidelines that the Councilmember is going to follow as she continues her work in office. We also hope it will be a tool for the Community Board, and developers. There is no official outcome.

Public Session - YouTube marker - 0:43:28

Neil Herdan - Requesting a balanced approach to the traffic patterns west of Steinway Street and East of Vernon Boulevard. Concerned that 3 lanes of traffic converging into a small one way street will result in more traffic deaths.

Gloria Maloney, Dutch Kill Civic Association - Shared concerns about the change in traffic patterns on 31st Street.

Michelle Allen - Requested better lighting, security, transportation and safety around 4th Street between 26th & 27th Avenue as well as programs to assist seniors and residents in the neighborhood for next years' capital & expense budget.

Louis Farucci - Spoke about the property of 23-34 30th Street being converted from medical facilities to residential condos without public notice. The operator received approval to become a shelter which is now causing crime spikes.

Sergeant Ranpreet Jaswal - 114th precinct Quality of Life Team - Spoke about recent drag racing incidents and illegal car takeovers on residential streets. The 114 precinct received complaints and calls about drag racing, illegal car meetups, and individuals doing donuts up by Ditmars Boulevard, Hazen Street, and around 21st Avenue. The incident happened at around 10 p.m. There were two 311 calls documented for that incident. When officers arrived within 10 minutes of the calls they noticed that the street was completely ruined by the burned tire marks. Because of that Malba incident, there's a lot more attention for these types of criminal acts. One Police Plaza is giving these incidents their attention and police precincts are harping on the fact that police response has to be better for these incidents. The Police Department is monitoring any 311 and 911 calls coming over for illegal car meetups, drag racing, and disorderly groups. It's become apparent that the guys that are doing these burnouts and the donuts don't reside here and they're terrorizing these streets. I just want to reiterate that if there are any incidents in the 114th precinct in the Astoria in Long Island City area, please call 911 as an emergency response. There was an incident where a community member posted videos on social media expecting police to do something when 911 was not contacted. 311 complaints were not made in a timely manner or the community board was not advised of the situation. Posting videos on social media is good - it spreads awareness, but if you want a timely police response please call 911 if there's any car meetups, illegal drag racing, or things of that nature. If you happen to see that it's an ongoing occurrence, please reach out to 311. Everything's documented. Everything is followed up with the Q team officers at the 114th precinct. Or if you have any community complaints, concerns, questions, comments, anything of that nature, please reach out to the community board through Florence.

Q&A YouTube marker 0:37:10

Kian Betancourt - Wondered how the police policy not to chase vehicles which creates an unsafe condition for the community impacts NYPD's ability to catch these criminals. Also asked if the NYPD is doing undercover work to try to catch offenders.

Sergeant Jaswal - The chase policy prohibits chasing for nonviolent misdemeanors or traffic violations which is the category these violations fall under so we cannot pursue. The best course of action is to grab the license plate number but often the plates are covered. We notify the highway district (because they do tend to flee on highways) so they could try to follow undetected, see when it stops and try to get the apprehension from there. The Community Response Team responds to drag racing incidents. They are assisted by aviation whenever possible for large car meetups. They stay on top of anything that's posted on social media.

Athanasios Magoutas - Wanted to know if the NYPD could adopt an automated response by working with DEP to abate this issue. Also, CODE Nightclub issues continue unabated - over 20 vehicles parked on the sidewalk. The response to 311 calls is "no evidence" so nothing has changed there.

Sergeant Jaswal - NYPD has been working with DEP to get sound meters on Steinway Street. We haven't received the equipment yet but we are pursuing it. Our enforcement team is also working overnight, but if we can get something automated that would help out. It requires funds and planning. CODE is still on the radar. Almost all of the enforcement we do is around CODE nightclub. I believe what you saw was towing for a society dinner that was occurring there. The enforcement team works until 2am and is very aware of CODE nightclub. There should be a meeting with CODE in January.

Chair Report

Chair Evie Hantzopoulos - Introduced the Community Board 1 office staff members; congratulated Thomas Wright who was elected as a Judge for the 2nd Municipal Court so he will have to resign the board; next month is election for officers which occurs every two years; Thanked the Transportation committee for their work on having the bus stop at 8th Street and 27th Avenue reinstated by DOT and MTA; thanked everyone for their hard work and wished them peace in the coming year.

District Manager Report - YouTube marker 0:55:06

Florence Koulouris, District Manager - Announcements: Thanked the board members for taking time from their families to help their community.

Reported that the Department of Sanitation is seeking per diem, seasonal workers for emergency snow shoveling of bus stops, crosswalks, fire hydrants and other public areas after heavy snowfalls. Pay starts at \$19.14 per hour and increases to \$28.71 per hour after the first 40 hours of a work week. Applicants must be at least 18 years old, eligible to work in the United States and able to perform heavy physical labor. Visit DSNY's website for more information.

Complaints: DEP Manhole covers in the vicinity of 21st Street; Con Edison plates in the vicinity of Elm Jack; DOT street light repair 14th Street, 32nd Street, 23rd Street; request to move stop sign at 30th Rd. for visibility; request to install traffic signal 23rd Street, 56th Street; road surface repair 23rd Street, 24th Street, 28th Street, 24th Avenue; construction debris removal in street on 20th Avenue; pothole repair 24th Ave, 20th Ave to 19 Ave, 21st Avenue, 24th Ave, 41st Street; Uber/Lyft causing traffic congestion Ingrams Mountain; outdoor shed isn't removed 30th Ave; public indecency/urination 14th Street, 19 Avenue, 20th Avenue; cars damaged near Queensview 24th Street; All have been reported to the appropriate agencies for resolution.

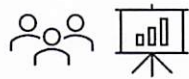
