Replacement of Storm Sewer and Water Main on 183rd Street between 90th Avenue and Jamaica Avenue. 24-hour full road closure of intersection 183rd Street and Jamaica Avenue begins

PRESENTATION

David Mandel, Community Liaison, Public Art, NYC Department of Cultural Affairs

- Tonight, I'm going to tell you a little bit about the present for art program, because we have an upcoming project in your district, which is related to the upcoming basically Park branch library renovation and expansion project. When I refer to public art, we're talking about the successful intersection of community public space and art.
- The present for our program is based on the percent for art law, which was passed in 1982, which states that 1% of capital funds for every new constructed or reconstructed city own building must allocate 1% towards a workup public art. The images you see here is at the dedication, the first percent for art piece in 1985 dedication ceremony with them Mayor Ed Koch in the picture on the left and you can see the work of art still standing today, as these are meant as a kind of not these are temporary installations, these are permanent public works of art.
- I'm going to tell you a little bit about how do we commission of work of art, being present for our program. This process is done through a two-meeting process we have to what we call panel meetings, and for this project. I can tell you specifically the first panel meeting is coming up on February 23. And at that meeting, what we do is we have a meeting where we convene with architects, The project design team.
