

Filing Claims Against The City of New York ecLAIM Go to <u>NYC.GOV</u> pull down the Comptroller Office Tab

Personal Injury and Property Damage claims can now be filed electronically via eClaim. The first step is to download the type of claim form you wish to file. i.e Personal Injury or Property Damage (Property Damage or Loss, Automobile Property Damage and/or Water Damage). Second Step, Follow the directions within the form. The more information you can provide, the easier it will be to investigate your claim. Continue eClaim filling process by certifying all information that will be provided is true and correct. Attach documents. Wait for receipt . Easy as 1-2-3.

Rain Barrel Giveaway Program

As part of its citywide stormwater management effort to reduce stormwater runoff and create a more livable, sustainable city, DEP initiated the Rain Barrel Giveaway Program in spring 2008 and distributed 250 barrels to homeowners in Queens Community Boards 12 and 13. Rain barrels capture stormwater from your roof and store it for future use such as watering your lawn or garden. Initiated by the Jamaica Bay Watershed Protection Plan, DEP targeted neighborhoods with the watershed for the second phase of the pilot program in 2009. DEP received a tremendous response for the program and distributed 750 barrels in 2009. 2011 Rain Barrel Giveaway DEP is giving away another thousand rain barrels across the City in 2011.
