Re: <u>CB2 HHSE Letter of Support – Int. No. 1096-2024</u>

Dear Council Member Julie Won:

The Queens Community Board 2 (CB2) Health and Human Services and Education and Unhoused & Shelter Taskforce Committee (hereinafter "HHSE Committee") supports and advocates on behalf of the NYC retirees in urging the New York City Council to pass Int. No. 1096-2024, which will preserve retiree health care choices by mandating the City to offer Medicare-eligible City retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents at least one Medigap plan with benefits equivalent to or better than those available to City retirees and their dependents as of December 31, 2021. Of note, Int. No. 1096-2024 would not "impair the ability of any employee organization to negotiate the terms and conditions of employment for their employee members."

Notably, Int. No. 1096-2024 does not materially differ from Int. No. 1099-2023, which was the subject of a resolution presented to the full board at its December 17, 2023 meeting. At that meeting, the full board voted unanimously (with none opposed and no abstentions) to support a resolution exhorting the New York City Council to enact Int. No. 1099-2023, which would have amended the Administrative Code to protect NYC retirees' vested health insurance coverage and contributions. In keeping with the Board's previously held position, the HHSE endorses the current legislative measure that aims to preserve the health care choice of NYC retirees.

Council Member Won, so many of your constituents have served the City and now seek to enjoy the retirement benefits they earned. The issue of healthcare is extremely important and must be safeguarded for the NYC retirees who worked for their healthcare rights. In addition to noting "that city retirees earned and paid for their benefits and were made promises during their employment," Int. No. 1099-2024 recognizes that "it is critical to protect the health care choice of city retirees" so as "to ensure full access to health care and to minimize the need for emergency room and Medicaid expenditures." Many seniors are already struggling to make ends meet--a reality made more dire in the face of pending federal cuts and rising costs of living. They should not have to bear the burden of increased medical costs.

For the above-stated reasons, Queens Community Board 2's HHSE Committee strongly supports the passage of Int. No. 1096-2024 and urges you, Council Member Won, and your fellow NYC Council Members to enact this bill.
