Floyd Bennett Field Flatbush Avenue/Marine Parkway

Cars enter along Flatbush Avenue and make a left into the main entrance, immediately before the toll bridge.

## Staten Island: Saturday, September 27, 2025

**Midland Beach Parking Lot 8** Father Capodanno Boulevard & Hunter Avenue Cars approach from Slater Boulevard.

## Queens: Saturday, October 18, 2025

**Resorts World Casino, Parking lot C** Cars approach east on Rockaway blvd & 107th St and make a right into the casino. | Walk-in area available for residents taking public transportation

## **Bronx: Saturday, October 25, 2025**

Orchard Beach Parking Lot Cars follow Park Drive to the end.

#### **Automotive Products**

(antifreeze, motor oil, transmission fluid, batteries, gasoline)



#### **Household Products**

(cleaners, pesticides, paint, compact fluorescent light bulbs, flammable gas, fire extinguishers, rechargeable batteries, thermostats, e-cigarettes)



#### **Medical Items**

(medications, syringes, needles, scalpels, lancets)



#### **Electronics**

(computers and accessories, TVs and video equipment, cell phones, tablets, e-readers, video game consoles)

# **How to Safely Package Materials Before Dropping Off**







Read item labels carefully before handling. Follow directions for any items labeled DANGER, POISON, or CAUTION.

DO NOT mix products or bring open containers.

#### To get items ready for transport:

- Label products clearly.
- Seal containers tightly.
- Place syringes and lancets in leak-proof, puncture-resistant containers (like "sharps" containers).
- Pack leaky items inside larger containers, using absorbent material to soak up excess fluid.
- Put items with broken glass into separate sealed bags or boxes.
