NYC Department of Transportation

Open Streets - Streets Opened for Social Distancing

Open Streets are available daily from 8am to 8pm for pedestrians and cyclists.

No through traffic permitted while Open Streets are in effect. Vehicle traffic is limited to local deliveries, pick-ups/drop-offs, necessary city service vehicles, utility vehicles, and emergency vehicles only. When Alternate Side is in effect drivers must move their vehicles and may return when ASP is over. These drivers are advised to be extremely cautious and to drive 5 MPH or slower.

Notify NYC - Winter Storm Warnings

Always use caution when walking, bilking or driving

As we head into the colder weather, here are some important tips:

<u>Before an Outage</u>: Charge cell phones, gather supplies, turn refrigerator/freezers to a colder setting.

<u>During an Outage</u>: Stay clear of downed power lines, turn off all appliances, do not use generators indoors; keep refrigerator/freezer doors closed to prevent food spoilage. If you have a disability/access needs, or use Life Sustaining Equipment and need immediate assistance, dial 911.

NYC Department of Sanitation

Enforcement of the NYS Plastic Bag Ban and Paper Bag Fee has begun. Stores will be penalized for distributing single use plastic bags and must collect a 5-Cent fee on paper bags. Please use a reusable bag, wash it often and keep our environment clean. Visit www.nyc.gov/bags for more information.

Sunnyside Library

The Sunnyside Library will be closing starting November 5, 2020 for a construction project that is expected to take approximately two months. NYC Fire Department

Propane-Fueled Space Heaters in Outdoor Dining Areas
Propane is one type of liquefied petroleum gas. It is flammable and can be readily ignited by a spark. If confined or exposed to fire, propane poses an explosion hazard. Based upon these hazards, its use is regulated by the Fire Department and is allowed for space heating only as specified in the Mayor's Emergency Executive Order 153 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The MTA will be giving out a \$50 Fine for refusal to wear a mask on public transportation. The vast and overwhelming majority of New Yorkers are doing a fantastic job when it comes to maintaining safe distances and wearing masks in the system. This new policy is intended to give the MTA an additional tool to keep customers safe as ridership increases.
