## Help is available now to prepare your home for colder days ahead.



With forecasts calling for higher energy prices again this winter, you may be looking around your home for ways to reduce energy use. Now is a great time to consider EmPower New York, a program which provides no-cost energy efficiency solutions to income-eligible New Yorkers. EmPower New York's free home energy assessment identifies areas of energy improvements including:

- Tips on how to save energy
- Installation of high-efficiency lighting
- Attic and wall insulation
- Replacement of old, inefficient refrigerators and freezers
- Water-saving showerheads

First, you may need to make improvements to your home to make it ready for weatherization services. That's where the **Weatherization Equity Program** comes in. Through this program, your home may be eligible to receive a number of improvements.\*

## A variety of contractor services are offered through the Weatherization Equity Program:

- Do you suspect there may be a gas leak in your home? (Important note: If you smell gas, act fast! Leave right away and call 911 or our gas emergency line, 1-718-643-4050)
- Are you concerned with the ventilation in your home and possible carbon monoxide leaks?
- Are you experiencing plumbing and moisture control issues in your bathroom or kitchen?
- Are your appliances malfunctioning or not working at all?
- Is your roof leaking?
