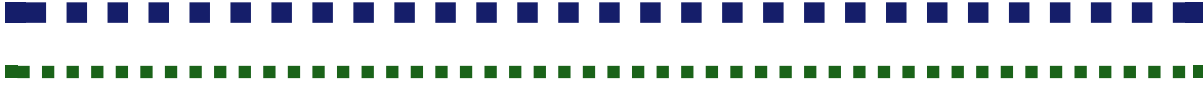

The IRS started accepting and processing 2024 tax returns on January 27, 2025. The deadline to file a tax return for your 2024 taxes is April 15, 2025.

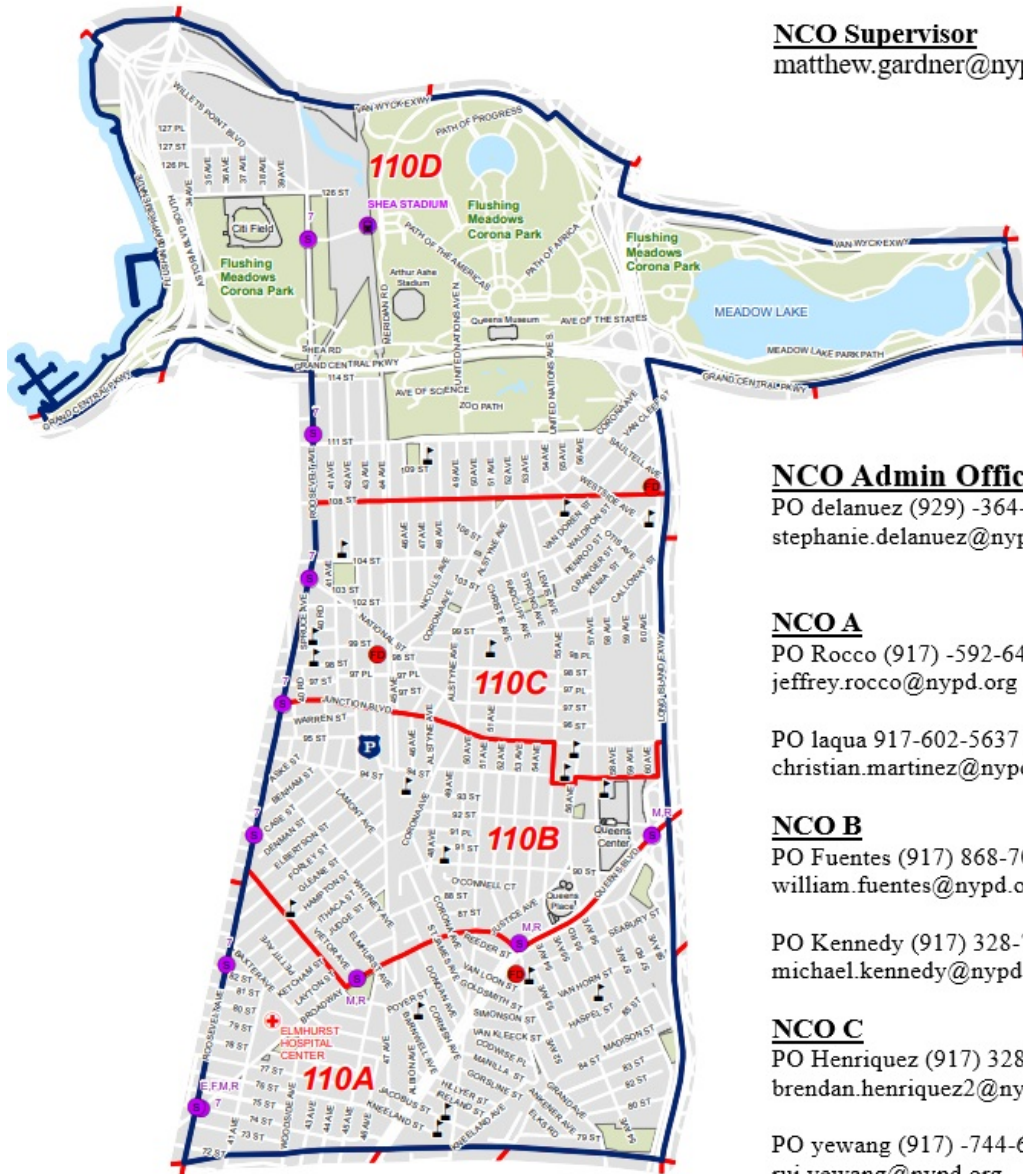
