Beginning **November 12, 2024**, all properties with 1-9 residential units will be required to use bins (55 gallons or less), with secure lids to set out trash. This rule also applies to any special-use building with DSNY collection—including City agencies, houses of worship, and nonprofits.

You can use a compliant bin (55 gallons or less with a secure lid) that you already have, but starting **June 2026**, you MUST use an **Official NYC Bin**.

NYC Official Bin

The NYC Bin is available for purchase at a significantly lower price than similar bins at retail stores, at <u>www.bins.nyc</u> or by calling 1-855-NYC-BINS.

Order your Official NYC Bins by October 1 to get guaranteed delivery by November 12!

DSNY will retrofit or replace hundreds of collection trucks by 2026, adding mechanical tipping arms compatible with the new bins. This upgrade will speed up collection and minimize the possibility of spills that occur with manual collection.

Recycling and Composting

NYC Bins are available to order for recycling and composting, although they are not required. Compost must be set out in bins (55 gallons or less) with secure lids. Curbside Composting is mandatory in Brooklyn and Queens and will expand to all five boroughs October 6.

About the New York City Department of Sanitation

The Department of Sanitation (DSNY) keeps New York City healthy, safe and clean by collecting, recycling and disposing of waste, cleaning streets and vacant lots, and clearing snow and ice. The Department operates 59 district garages and manages a fleet of more than 2,000 rear-loading collection trucks, 450 mechanical brooms and 705 salt spreaders. The

Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.





Fire Department, City of New York FIRE SAFETY EDUCATION



The Sabbath and Jewish holidays are a time of family gatherings, celebrated with special foods, songs and customs. Many holy days and observances, as well as the weekly Sabbath, are a time for traditional cooking and candle rituals.

However, without safety precautions, these customary religious observances may increase the risk for fires and fire-related injuries.




PREPARING THE KITCHEN AND COOKING

Fifty percent of all apartment fires and one-quarter of the fires in private homes start in the kitchen. Most home cooking fires involve the stovetop portion of the range. One-third of these fires result from unattended cooking.

The majority of fires and burns can be prevented during food preparation by taking safety precautions. Follow these precautions when preparing the kitchen and cooking, especially for the Sabbath and holiday meals when there is increased activity in the kitchen:

- Stay in the kitchen--don't leave cooking food unattended.
- Wear tighter or snug-fitting sleeves. (Loose sleeves are more likely to catch on fire or get caught on pot handles.)
- Take extra precaution when handling boiling water.
- Cook at indicated temperature settings, rather than higher settings.
- Don't become distracted by attending to children or answering phone calls or doorbells.
- Create a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around your stove.
- Keep area clear of towels, papers or anything that could burn.
- Turn pot handles inward, facing the wall, to prevent burns caused by overturning or spills.
- Have a pot lid and container of baking soda handy to smother a pan fire. DO NOT USE WATER.
- Treat burns immediately with cool running water and seek medical attention.

Between Neighborhoods (109', 2016-2024) explores how the histories of immigration and imperialism orbit the Unisphere in Queens since the last New York World's Fair. Seth Fein's award-winning documentary works in split-screen between present and past, between original footage and archival research, to examine how Robert Moses's monument to himself - marking the center of his metropolitan empire as it embodied the Space Age ideology of Washington's empire - has been redefined by immigration across the last 60 years. Yet, as Between Neighborhood shows, Unisphere now centers a raging battle between social and corporate globalizations in Flushing Meadows-Corona Park, relevant not just for Queens but for all of NYC.

Seth Fein is a historian and documentary artist who lives in Jackson Heights, where he founded and operates Seven Local Film. Among his recent films is *Small Kitchens*, an observational tone poem about food and work in a Nepalese restaurant and Mexican food cart along the Elmhurst-Jackson Heights border. He has taught Film and History at Barnard, Columbia, NYU, and Yale, as well as in Brooklyn College's Feirstein Graduate School of Cinema. Fein has published widely on the history of film in the Americas, and his recent essays about contemporary documentary have appeared in *The Village Voice* and *The Los Angeles Review of Books*. 
