HOMEOWNERS
Apply for an exemption and lower your property tax bill

- **STAR:** Homeowners with an annual income of \$500,000 or less.
- **ESTAR:** Seniors aged 65+ with an annual income of \$86,300 or less.
- **SCHE/DHE:** Seniors aged 65+, or disabled homeowners with an annual income of \$58,399 or less.
- **Veterans:** Who served in the U.S. military during designated periods of conflict, their unmarried surviving spouse, and Gold Star parents.
- **Clergy:** Active and retired members of the clergy and their unmarried surviving spouse. Must be a resident of NY State.

TENANTS
Seniors and peoples with disabilities can apply for SCRIE or DRIE and keep your rent from increasing if you:

- Live in a rent-regulated apartment.
- Spend more than 1/3 of your income on rent.
