Public Hearing

150-65 Cross Island Parkway - BSA Calendar #129-97-BZ - Extension of term of variance for a term of twenty years. A waiver of the Rule of Procedure is also required pursuant to section 1-07.3(b)(3)(ii) since the variance expired on November 4, 2018. Land Use/ Zoning Committee Chair Kevin Shields.

Presentation by representatives for applicant:

Application for an extension of term of variance for twenty years and a waiver of rules of procedure since the previous term expired November 4th, 2018. The original variance was granted for an automotive service establishment Use Group 16. Located in a Commercial Zone C1-2 R3-2.

The prior variance permitted gasoline pumps, canopy, and lubritorium. The rest of the property has an as-of-right use retail stores Use Group 6 on the basement level and retail Use Group 6 on the first floor. This application is not changing anything, only extending the term for twenty years. This is on the Northwest corner of Clintonville Street and the Cross Island Parkway. A new canopy will be erected to replace the previous one damaged during a recent storm. The building is two stories with a basement.

Public Hearing & Regular Meeting Minutes – March 14, 2022

Matt Silverstein: Will another gas station take over?

A: No change in ownership It will stay as Exxon. The canopy fell during a recent storm. They will install a new one in about two weeks. The new canopy will be the same size.

Warren Schreiber: Are there any air pumps at this site?A: Yes. next to the two vacuums in the same spot since 2000.

Cody Herman: If this expired in 2018, why are we addressing this in 2022?A: The City is behind in processing their paperwork. We didn't receive the paperwork until recently.Chairman Kelty: In the past, we never got these on time. They are always a year or two behind.

Chuck Apelian: I have a question about a previous application for this site to replace the service station with retail. **A:** The application was withdrawn a few years ago.

Kevin Shields: We held a Committee Meeting to discuss the renewal of this application for another twenty-year term without any changes. The Whitestone Taxpayers Civic Group said that this location is kept clean. Motion was to approve.

Chuck Apelian: Motion is to approve the twenty-year term. Absent any discussion on the motion, I will move the question and will take a roll call.
