A Word from CB8...

Dear Resident,

Spring is almost here! There will soon be April showers followed by beautiful May flowers, unfortunately weeds as well.

Community Board 8 has been advocating for more center median clean-ups. In addition, we also asked that the administration fund contracts to spray the weeds in the center medians with non-toxic environmentally conscious herbicide. The City had ceased spraying weeds since the herbicides used were toxic. This made it quite difficult for the Department of Sanitation to remove them and clean the center medians.

If you recall last year, there was an issue with the center medians under the jurisdiction of the Department of Sanitation not being properly maintained. The whole spring season, no work was performed despite continuous requests from our office. The agency finally started to clean them within our district after a press conference held by Borough President Donovan Richards which the Queens Community Board Chairs and District Managers joined in August.

We learned that Council Member Linda Lee joined Council Members Selvena Brooks Powers and Nantasha Williams to introduce legislation that would require that the center medians be cleaned at least on a quarterly basis. It is Intro 1147-2024, which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. While there are committee meetings scheduled for March and April, this item is not yet on the agenda.

We will keep you posted once we have new information.



NYC Department of Finance Property Tax Exemptions

Co-op/Condo Tax Abatement

The cooperative and condominium tax abatement reduces the property taxes of eligible condominium and co-op owners.

Individual unit owners do not apply for the abatement. Instead, the managing agent or board applies on behalf of the entire development.

Both the development itself and the individual unit owners must meet certain eligibility requirements.

Did you know that the income threshold to qualify for property tax exemptions have increased? The new income requirement for the Senior Citizen's Homeowners' Exemption, or the Disabled Exemption has increased to \$58,399. The deadline to apply is March 15, 2025. Please do not delay, and file an application online today by visiting www.nyc.gov/ownerexemption to learn more.


Department of Social Services NEWS PHONE SCAM ALERT

This is to inform you of recent reports received by the Department of Social Services of clients who received telephone calls from individuals "spoofing" the DSS's customer service telephone number (718-557-1399). Spoofing is when a caller deliberately falsifies the information transmitted to your caller ID to disguise their identity.

The caller ID on these calls may appear to be the DSS's customer service number, but the call is actually originating from a different source. The agency would like to emphasize to all its clients that legitimate DSS's representatives will <u>never</u> call a client to request account or EBT card information. Clients should <u>never</u> provide such information in response to unsolicited telephone calls, even if the caller ID appears to be from the DSS.
