## 4. Monthly Update Report 102 Pct.

Captain Courtney Nilan reported on the following:

- There is a 23% decrease in all major crimes in the 102<sup>nd</sup> Pct. year to date and 22% for the month. Forty fewer reports were taken for major crimes.
- A 58-year old woman was struck by a school bus earlier this morning at the intersection of Kew Gardens Rd & 82<sup>nd</sup> Rd. The 102<sup>nd</sup> Pct. Collision Investigation Squad is investigating the incident and will give their recommendations to DOT as to how to make that intersection safer.
- The first shooting incident of the year took place on 117<sup>th</sup> St and 101<sup>st</sup> Ave on Sunday at 4 AM where three individuals were involved with non-life threatening injuries. With the help of 106<sup>th</sup> Pct., the perpetrator was arrested and charged with the shooting of three people.
- Capt. Nilan stressed the importance of not leaving any personal properties unlocked in order to prevent smaller larcenies, i.e., car breakings, etc.
- PO Jose Severino received Officer of the Year Award for 2017 and Sgt. Joe DeMarco received the 2017 Supervisor of the Year Award.

Chair Rampershad gave his final speech and recapped the following:

In an effort to try to change the atmosphere, my approach to help improve the board was to focus on the number of issues that the board faced one at a time and to make sure that I delegated tasks.
