8. Education & Youth Services Committee Report- Seth Welins

Mr. Welins reported on the following issues which were discussed at the Education District Council # 27 meeting:

- the new elementary school, PS 316 on the corner of 90th St & 101st Ave that will be opening in September of 2014 and accommodate 224 students.
- lack of security and difficulties on getting funding for installation of security cameras in schools.

Mr. Welins attended PS 56 after school program –Child Center for NY Program which in addition to academic programs, has art, technology, etc.

The teachers union and the city have still not agreed on Teacher evaluations and DOE is in jeopardy of losing more money.

Kindergarten registration will start on March 1st, 2013.

9. <u>Health & Social Services Committee Report- Evelyn Baron</u>

Evelyn Baron reported on funding for Obamacare in the form of health service cuts in the following areas:

Senior citizen population: Medicare and other services have been cut across the board and 59% of home health agencies nationwide are running in the red.

Infant population: Early Intervention (EI) program has also had major reductions. Children with special needs will no longer receive care across their lifespan.

Ms. Baron spoke about the commendable work of the Red Cross since Hurricane Sandy and their impressive statistics, which are available at the board office.
