<u>Paul Capocasale, Woodhaven Resident</u>, spoke against the Woodhaven SBS project and presented pictures of accidents that occurred due to changes that already took place.

# 7. Education & Youth Services Committee Report – Seth Welins, Chair

- The Education committee is trying to set up a meeting with representatives of a proposed new charter school that hopes to locate within our district.
- A new report shows that 10% of all NYC public school students were homeless at some point during the 2016-17 school year. This figure represents a 6% increase over the

previous year. The DOE hired 43 new social workers for schools that have a large population of homeless students. Many homeless students miss many weeks of school and need support during this very stressful time in their lives.

## 8. Parks, Environment & Sanitation Committee Report – J.R. Smith & Regina Santoro, Co-Chairs

• DSNY Organic Expansion Presentation, Andrew Hoyles, Senior Manager, Organic Outreach

Mr. Hoyles stated that the Organics Collection Program allows the Department of Sanitation to collect food scraps, food-soiled paper, and yard waste from residents in select areas and turn it into compost or renewable energy.

Participation is voluntary. There are no fines for not participating in the organics collection program.

DSNY is in the process of delivering free brown bins and will start collection organics the week of October 29<sup>th</sup> on the recycling day.
