### 4. MONTHLY UPDATE NYPD 102<sup>nd</sup> Pct. Report

Capt. Naor reported on the major crime stats for the last four weeks, stating that there was an increase in robberies and grand larcenies. Two guns were seized in the last three weeks.

The Community Clean Up Event will take place on Babbage St between 84<sup>th</sup> and Hillside Avenues on Saturday, March 19<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM. Any donations of paint supplies and gloves will be greatly appreciated.

Among the topics that were discussed were: budget increase requests for police and shortage of police officers, lack of street parking due to excess of derelict vehicles, crime rising at train stations, etc.

The committee is asking all to call their Council Members and the mayor and ask them to consider this proposal which will save the city millions of dollars.

# 14. PARKS, RECREATION & ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE REPORT - Regina Santoro, Chair

Stated that mayor Adams' preliminary budget proposal will cut the NYC Parks budget by \$60M. Because of this cut 3,500 essential NYC Parks jobs (including PEP officers and maintenance staff) will expire on June 30.

Ms. Santoro invited all to a rally with the Play Fair Coalition which will take place on the day of the NYC Parks

Budget Hearing on Tuesday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022 at 9 AM.

She also stated that the proposed restoration budget for the repairs of the Barking Lot is \$1.72M.
