4. MONTHLY UPDATE NYPD 102nd Pct. Report

Capt. Jeremy Kivlin, the 102nd Pct. Commanding Officer, reported on the following:

- Over 200 derelict vehicles were towed away through the Ro-Tow Program.
- The Precinct has been addressing complaints about noise coming from loud mufflers of motorcycles and dirt bikes. Over 114 of them were taken off the street year to date.
- Over 700 hundred summonses were issued year to date for overnight commercial vehicles parked on residential streets.
- There was a 25% decrease in car theft in the last 28 days.
- There is a spike in robberies and burglaries which the 102nd Pct. is looking to correct.
- There has not been one shooting in the 102nd Pct. in at least 56 days.
- · Homeless outreach is being addressed on a weekly basis.

Question and answer period followed.

5. CHAIRPERSON'S REMARKS & EXEC. REPORT-Sherry Algredo/District Manager's Report-James McClelland

- DM McClelland welcomed everyone back. He hoped everyone had a great and healthy summer.
- Took a moment of silence for Victor Ampuero who sadly passed away a year ago at the end of August.
- Wished happy birthday to Sandra Datnarain, Bernard Robert, Maharani Singh, Esta-Joy Sydell, and Marie Turley.
- Congratulated Chair Algredo who was the Grand Marshall of Senator James Sanders Queens Carnival Parade.
- Stated that agency budget consultations are starting tomorrow. He will be sending an email requesting board
 members submit Capital/Expense project ideas for fiscal year 2023. Please send your suggestions to the office or call
 the DM directly. Local civic groups on CB9 mailing list will also be contacted for their suggestions. Please be advised
 that the deadline for submission is October 31st. The DM will reach out to Committee Chairs to ask their assistance in
 writing policy summaries for their respective areas to include in DM's District Needs Report.
- DM McClelland stated that It's been a busy summer. The board participated in many events: Night Out Against Crime, Health Fair, Community Clean-up Events, and other local events.
- CB9 had a very successful Economic Development Small Business Forum. Committee Co-Chairs will speak about it during their report.
- Since January the office has received over 200 complaints, concerns, or questions regarding various quality of life issues and requesting assistance. A vast majority of these cases have been resolved and we will continue working to ensure that each one is closed to the satisfaction of the constituent.
- The next District Service Cabinet Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, September 15th, 2022.

<u>Council Member Lynn Schulman</u> reported on summer events and happenings, office personnel changes and budget allocations for her district. She also stated that Mayor Adams gave \$30M for Phase One of the Queens Way Project.

<u>Assembly Member Jenifer Rajkumar</u> thanked Chair Algredo and DM McClelland for organizing the Small Business Forum. She reported on her district's fund allocations, summer happenings and events.

7. ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT – Matthew Singh & Kirpal Billing, Co-Chairs

Mr. Mathew Singh reported on the committee's first Economic Business Community Event stating in was a big success. Business owners were able to meet the elected officials and address their concerns. He expressed his gratitude to Chair Algredo and DM McClelland for helping to organize the event. Mr. Singh thanked local business owners for donating food and refreshments.

Mr. Billing stated that these kinds of events should become a trend and should take place regularly.

9. EDUCATION & YOUTH SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT – Alexandria Sumpter-Delves & Seth Welins, Co-Chairs

Alexandria Sumpter-Delves reported on the following:

- Education Committee will reach out to Parent Coordinators and liaisons in the district to share its work and assess school needs.
- Formal overview of Education Committee responsibilities and goals for the year will be sent to the Chair for review.
- Council offices were thanked for their support of reallocation of funding to schools.
- Next meeting will be held on Monday, September 26th via Zoom at 6 PM.

10. TRANSPORTATION & TRAFFIC COMMITTEE REPORT - Faiuze Ali, Chair:

- Street co-namings are tabled until October 11th meeting.
- The E and Z trains are still out of commission due to ongoing track replacement. The estimated completion time is October 1st.
- Still waiting for the newest proposal for Queens Bus Redesign plan from the MTA.
- Congestion pricing has closed its public comment period on September 9th.
- Congratulated Chair Algredo for being honored by the Trinidadian & Toboggan USA Organization for her leadership
 as a woman of color, stating that it is a well-earned award.

11. HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT - Marla Abarca, Chair

Ms. Abarca said that they had a tour of Jamaica Hospital with the Chair and the District Manager over the summer where they met with the CEO and other people from different departments. Ms. Abarca plans to arrange similar meetings with other hospitals.

The next committee meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 5th.

12. LAND USE & HOUSING COMMITTEE REPORT - Sylvia Hack & Andrea Crawford, Co-Chairs

Co-chair Hack stated that the committee agreed to request a meeting with New York City's Comptroller, Brad Lander, and put together not only the projected costs of the jails, but what the \$10 billion deficit the city faces means (while at the same time spending \$15 billion to build tower jails which cannot fulfill the city 's goals. Talking points about the plan and the city's goals have already been prepared. The committee will add some of the critical needs the city faces which require billions of dollars.

13. PARKS, RECREATION & ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE REPORT - J. Richard Smith, Chair

Mr. Smith stated that Council Member Joan Ariola has secured funds for re-varnishing the park at Equity Park which is adjacent to P.S. 60. Mr. Smith will be attending meetings regarding park's design proposals.

14. BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT – John Carter, Chair

Mr. Carter stated that FY23 Budget has bumped up by about 3%, however, when compared against the backdrop of city affairs and what Mayor Adams has asked for, he would not be surprised if the city would come back looking for some of that money to be returned or to be cut.

15. BY-LAW COMMITTEE REPORT - REAZ KHAN, CHAIR

Mr. Khan stated that many newer members have expressed interest in learning about parliamentary procedure and motions. He will invite someone from the Mayor's Office of Community Affairs to discuss the guide on parliamentary procedure they have put out for community boards in the past. The committee members are grateful to anyone with contacts who can facilitate this.

<u>Linda Fogal, Rep. Council Member Joann Ariola</u> stated that the Council Member will be sponsoring a School Ambassador Program in her district.

Ms. Fogal reported on other events sponsored by the Council Member and shared her contact information.

<u>Ean Fullerton, Rep. Senator Leroy Comrie</u> stated that September is Senior Appreciation Month, therefore the Senator will be sponsoring a variety of events to commemorate it.

Rokeya Akhtar, Rep. Queens District Attorney Melinda Katz stated that a variety of internships are available in the DA's office for the Youth.

District Attorney Katz is doing everything to stop the flow of deadly weapons on the streets.

Maricela Cano, Representing Queens Borough President Donovan Richards:
