2. OPENING OF MEETING & READING OF MINUTES

4. CHAIRPERSON'S REMARKS & EXEC. Report-Sherry Algredo & District Manager's Report - J. McClelland

- DM McClelland wished Happy Birthday to Zoila Bofill, Reaz Khan, Regina Santoro, and Seth Welins.
- With the assistance of Council Member Schulman's Office, Queens EDC, and Sanitation Department we
 were able to clean and remove graffiti from the Austin street underpass.
- Met with Raimondo Graziano, Chief of Staff Senator Addabbo, John Perricone of Woodhaven BID, and Martin Colberg, President of the Woodhaven Residents Block Association to discuss a serious accident and an increase in street vendors along Jamaica Avenue.
- Attended the KGCA meeting. It was nice seeing everyone in person and discussing issues.

- Since January the office has received over 100 complaints, concerns, or questions regarding various quality of
 life issues and requesting assistance. The vast majority of these cases have been resolved and we can
 continue to work to ensure that each one is completed to the satisfaction of the constituent.
- The next District Service Cabinet Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 18th.
- A more user friendly and easy to transport sound system was purchased today.

Chair Algredo gave a brief recap of Borough Board meeting presentations for the month of May, 2023.

5. PUBLIC FORUM

<u>Sam Esposito, President OZPKRBA</u>, stated that the Ozone Park Lion's Adopt A Senior Program has kicked off. He also talked about their street co-naming request in honor of Camille Ferraro, a late teacher from St. Mary Gate of Heaven School.

<u>Bill Knight, Richmond Hill Resident</u> on behalf of the 95th Ave Residents Block Association, urged the board to vote against the liquor license application for the Infinity Bar & Lounge located at 119-12 101st Ave due to its proximity to the local nursery school.

<u>Juliette Ganpat, Richmond Hill Resident</u> also spoke against the liquor license application for the Infinity Bar & Lounge, formerly Showtime Bar & Lounge, located at 119-12 101st Ave due to its history of criminal activity and Multiple complaints from the residents of the surrounding area.

6. MONTHLY UPDATE NYPD 102nd Pct. Report

Capt. Jeremy Kivlin, the 102nd Precinct's Commanding Officer, presented Capt. Maldonado, the new 102nd Pct. Executive Officer and asked her to introduce herself.

Captain stated that crime is down overall year to date. There is a minor increase in commercial burglary cases on Jamaica Ave and 101st Ave where perpetrators gain access by breaking glass windows and stealing cash registers.

Question and answer period followed.

NYPD Chief of Patrol John Chell made a guest appearance to discuss how the police officers address community complaints and work to keep the neighborhood safe.

NYPD Chief Kevin Williams, the commanding officer of Patrol Borough Queens South, discussed crime, his summer plan, tow trucks and more and answered board members questions.

10. TRANSPORTATION & TRAFFIC COMMITTEE REPORT - Faiuze Ali, Chair

- Committee Chair Ali stated that Chair Algredo and he attended the co-naming ceremony of the intersection of 101st Ave and 118th Street in memory of Guru Nanak and thanked the Sikh Community for the invite.
- Mr. Ali visited the two problematic sites in Kew Gardens at the suggestion of fellow board members Nina Kulkarni and Kevin O'Leary. The results of those visits will be shared at the next meeting.
- Effective July, there will be changes in train services. The email was forwarded to the board members.
- Since the timing of speed cameras was changed to 24/7, the city collected \$100M excluding late fees and other fees.
- The next Transportation and Traffic Committee meeting will take place on the 4th Thursday of the month via Zoom.

11. HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT – Carmela Isabella, Chair

Chair Isabella stated that the committee decided to add Veteran Service to their list of responsibilities.

- Gave an update on Kew Gardens Jail Project and on the status of Lefferts Boulevard Bridge Restoration Project.

The office has forwarded Zoom meeting notifications regarding Equity Park Playground and Maurice Fitzgerald Park Playground Reconstruction Community Input. Committee Chair Smith encouraged all to participate and give their recommendations.

Mr. Billing stated that the committee will be working on improving office budget planning and expenditure for the upcoming year.

He asked for contributions for the Good and Welfare Fund.

Committee Chair Billings stated that the committee will be meeting on a quarterly basis.

16. BY-LAW COMMITTEE REPORT - FAIUZE ALI, CHAIR

Committee Chair Ali reminded all to participate in a virtual meeting with QBP Counsel Allan Swisher tomorrow at 7 PM. The meeting's primary objective is to facilitate and familiarize newly appointed members, and board members in general, with established board protocols, general functionality, the board's chairperson and district manager's roles, etc.

<u>Seth Urbinder, Rep. Council Member Lynn Schulman</u> stated that the office is accepting locations where garbage bins are needed.

Council Member is organizing a meeting with the community regarding the new school site on Jamaica Avenue. Date to be determined.

<u>Linda Fogal, Rep. Council Member Joann Ariola</u> made announcements regarding events sponsored by the Council Member, i.e., Job Fair at the Queens Chamber of Commerce, Night at the Opera with the Queens Symphony Orchestra, Rain Barrel Giveaway event, etc.
