Committee Chair Santoro stated that in the last week alone three illegal smoke shops opened on Jamaica Avenue. There are thirty-five illegal shops in CB9, nineteen of which are located between Woodhaven and Lefferts Blvd.

Ms. Santoro clarified that the legislation around cannabis sales and regulations for legal sites remains unclear. There is a lack of enforcement to punish businesses selling cannabis products illegally.

Their proximity to the schools and houses of worship is also an issue.

The committee will be seeking guidance from the NYS Office of Cannabis Management.
