2. PUBLIC FORUM

<u>Sam Esposito, President, Ozone Park Residents Block Association</u>, voiced his opinion on CB9 District Manager search and wished for the best candidate to be selected.

Chair Smith recognized Queens Borough President Melinda Katz who stated the following:

- Thanked the Board Members for the work they do for the future of generations to come.
- Stated that it's imperative that everyone in Queens is counted in the upcoming 2020 Census as it will determine our representation in the U.S. House of Representatives and how much federal funding (for our seniors, highways, affordable housing, etc.) we receive for the next ten years.

- Thanked all Kew Gardens organizations involved in the saving of the Lefferts Boulevard Bridge.
- Congratulated former Board Member Raj Rampershad whom she recently appointed to the NYC Planning Commission. NYC Planning Commission issues major land use decisions as it oversees the planning of the orderly growth and development of the city. Borough President Katz presented a Proclamation declaring Tuesday, November 13, 2018 to be "Raj Rampershad Day" in Queens.
- Presented Certificates of Completion of NYC Department of City Planning's Training Workshop for Queens Community Board Members to the following members: Raj Rampershad (former Board Member), Larraine Fletcher and Inderpaul Ahluwalia.
- Presented Andrea Crawford and Nick Comaianni with the Award for Fifteen Years of Service on the Board.

<u>Jagpreet Singh, Community Organizer CHHAYA CDC</u>, announced the opening of a first satellite office at 121-18 Liberty Ave in Richmond Hill. Mr. Singh stated that this non-profit community based organization has been providing their free services for over ten years in homeownership education & counseling, immigration services, tax preparation, small business counselling, ESL classes, tenants' rights counseling, etc.

<u>Paul Hudon, Kew Gardens Resident,</u> spoke against new Jail in Kew Gardens and stated that all Queens Community Boards should unite and oppose this proposal.

<u>David Hudon, Kew Gardens Resident</u>, spoke against closing Rikers Island and opening a new jail facility in Kew Gardens.

4. Monthly Update - NYPD Report 102nd Pct.

Sgt. Dotson stated that the 102nd Pct. is down 50% in crime for the last 28 days and over 15% down year to date. The numbers are up in little crimes, i.e. petty larcenies: property crimes, breaking into vehicles, etc.

Chairperson Smith recognized legislative representatives.

6. Land Use & Housing Committee Report - Sylvia Hack & Sherman Kane, Co-Chairs

▶ Land Use Review Process Application regarding Demapping 82nd Ave between 126th and 132nd St.

Sylvia Hack read the draft Queens CB9 Resolution that opposes the Demapping of 82nd Ave between 126th Street and 132nd Street:

This proposed Demapping is intended to enable a 1.9 million square foot jail to be constructed over this property. The Demapping will:

- 1. Remove parking from an area now heavily used for such.
- 2. Cut off access from 132nd street to Hoover Avenue. The latter now gives access to 83rd Ave across Queens Boulevard. Closing this street will also force pedestrians to go the long way around to access Hoover Avenue and Queens Boulevard.
- 3. This proposal is also premature. This application is labeled Land-Use Review application. The narrative accompanying this application would be part of a ULURP which has not even begun. ULURP begins upon certification of the whole application regarding the proposed jail in CB 9. Yet we receive this "polling" letter which accompanies a 21 page document and are told that we have 3 to 4 weeks to respond. And if we do not respond, then it is assumed that we have no objections.

8. Health & Social Services Committee Report – Marian C. Molina, Chair, stated the following:

An update was emailed to Chair Molina regarding Breaking Ground Drop-in Center for Homeless Adults at 100-32 Atlantic Ave stating that a construction phase at their facilities has been approved and is about to commence.

CB 9 is working on a resolution opposing the homeless shelter for mentally ill men at 85-15 101st Ave in Ozone Park. This population would be better served at a treatment facility where they are guaranteed shelter, financial assistance and proper medical treatment. The Mayor should consider housing homeless families and homeless single parents at this facility.

13. Guest Speaker, Queens Senior Executive Assistant District Attorney, James Quinn on Rikers Island Jail

Mr. Quinn spoke regarding the de Blasio administration's plan to close and replace Rikers Island with four Borough-based jails. He detailed the statistics on detainees, crime rate in NYC 1993 vs 2017, incarceration rates per 100,000 people, criminal case history of "bailable" defendants, etc. A copy of the presentation is available upon request.
