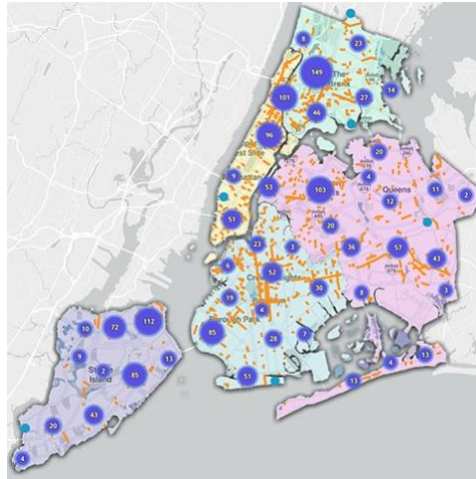

NEW YORK CITY IMPROVES ACCESS TO MAP SHOWING THE STORIES BEHIND CO-NAMED STREETS, PARKS AND OTHER LOCATIONS

Online Tool Improves Searchability of Streets “Co-Named” After Notable New Yorkers



New York, NY – Today, the New York City Department of Records and Information Services (DORIS) announced major improvements to the interactive City map that provides biographical information for nearly 2500 co-named streets and intersections. <https://streetnamesmap-nyc.hub.arcgis.com>

Initially launched in November 2024, the map provides online access to biographical and/or background information about persons or entities honored with a co-named street, intersection, park, or playground.

Changes include an easy-to remember URL - <https://streetnamesmap-nyc.hub.arcgis.com> - and enhanced search features.

Additional biographical information will be added quarterly, with the next update expected in June, 2025.
