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MS ROZEN: Okay. Good morning, everybody. Welcome to the New York
City Department of Small Business
Services virtual hearing. Today's
date is January 24, 2023. The time is
11:03 a.m. This is a public hearing
being held pursuant to the New York
City Administrate Procedure Act, also
known as CAPA. My name is Leemor
Rozen. I am a deputy general counsel
here at SBS. And present today are a
number of SBS staff members, and, I
believe, some members of the public.

Today's hearing concerns a

proposed rule to expand the Business

Preparedness and Resiliency Risk

Assessment and Grant Program. Also

known as the BPREP Grant Program. The

full text of the rule proposal and a

statement of the basis and purpose was

published in the City Record on

December 23, 2022, and on the New

York City Rules website. The proposed

rules were certified by the New York

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Law Department and the New York City

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Mayor's Office of Operations. By way of background, the BPREP

Grant Program was established in 2015 to help small businesses better prepare for emergencies resulting from severe weather and to enhance the resiliency of their operations, assets, and physical space. The Program accomplished this by providing resources and information on business continuity, best practices, conducting onsite resiliency assessments, providing grants to implement specific recommendations resulting from such assessments and creating online resiliency resources. Only businesses impacted by Hurricane Sandy were eligible to participate in the BPREP Grant Program, and the maximum grant amount a business could receive was \$3,000. This proposed rule would expand the BPREP program by, 1, extending eligibility to businesses

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1 2 and property owners in a larger geographical area, including areas at 3 4 risk of flooding, as Identified in the New York City Flood and Stormwater 5 Resiliency Maps. And, 2, increasing 6 7 the maximum grant amount available the grantees. The reimbursement-based 8 9 grants will help participating 10 businesses and property owners fund 11 the purchase of resiliency equipment, 12 such as flood barriers and backup 13 generators recommended by professional 14 consultants following onsite risk 15 assessments of their properties. At this time, we will open the 16 17 floor to give an opportunity to 18 members of the public to testify. We 19 did not receive any requests to 20 testify, so for anybody who has joined 21 this hearing and wishes to testify, we ask that you use the raise-hand 2.2 23 feature of Webex. 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2	MS ROZEN: So, we actually don't
3	usually answer questions during this
4	hearing. It's more of an opportunity
5	for other people to speak, if they
6	want to say something about you
7	know, they have opinions on the rule
8	and they want to share those.
9	I believe it's going up to
10	5,000, but you can read the text of
11	the rule on the New York City Rules
12	website, or in the City Record, where
13	it was published.
14	But I would ask if you could
15	identify your full name.

18	Paladino's office, Director of
