Mr. Hiram Rothkrug representing 2071 Victory Blvd. explained the variance does not expire until 2023. This is the B.P. gas station with 3 automotive bays with an accessory store at Bradley Avenue and Victory Blvd. This station has been there for 60 years. There have been no complaints. There is only one home that abuts this property who has not had any complaints. In addition, Mr. Rothkrug confirmed in writing the following day that he was going to reach out to the homeowner to insure there are no problems.

All conditions have been put on the C of O which are but not limited to, all lighting directed towards the station away from any homes, fencing be painted, fences and station free of graffiti, if graffiti occurs it will be removed within 48 hours, no cars parked on sidewalk, dumpster on side away from homeowner etc.

It was mentioned that the Governor's Executive order permits outdoor dining until the winter of 2022. Any restaurants that built outside dining in their parking lots, after the executive order has ended would be out of compliance since they would not meet the required parking spaces.

Right now, outside dining is permitted Sunday 10:00 A.M. until Midnight Monday-Thursday 8:00 A.M. – Midnight and Friday and Saturday 8:00 A.M. – 1:00 A.M.

Outside cafes is regulated through the zoning resolution. This amendment would take it out of the resolution.

DOT and the Department of Health would regulate the outside cafes including roadway cafes.

There was a discussion on the resolution.
