The M1 Hotels Text Amendment was certified and received in the CB#1 office a day ago. The committee will hold the Public Hearing at the June Land Use Committee Meeting.

NYC Planning Application No C 160401 ZMR - 5 Bement Avenue for an amendment to the zoning map **creating a C2-2 overlay over and existing R3-1.**

Mr. Todd Dale explained the application is to facilitate the development of a new one-story commercial (retail) building. The applicant proposes a 4,830 square foot building with accessory parking for 16 automobiles and a single, two-way curb cut on Richmond Terrace. The requested zoning map

amendment will facilitate the proposed development by permitting a commercial use, most like a Use Group 6 retail store.

Chairman Accornero mentioned the West Brighton/St. George Area Committee approved application.

Board of Standards & Appeals Application No. 2017-48-A 36 Hardy Street – mosque and school partially within the bed of a mapped street.

Mr. Akeeb Shekoni presented the application. The proposed development is requesting a waiver to allow development within the bed of a mapped but unbuilt portion of Waverly Place. The purpose is to combine the existing buildings into one big building by developing the open space between the buildings. The site currently is a Mosque and will remain as such.

Two City Planning Applications Nos. N 180234 ZAR and N 180252 ZAR have been submitted for 11 and 17 Haven Esplanade to build one –two family detached residences at each address in a Special Hillside Preservation District.

There was no representation for the application.

Mr. Accornero announced that the applicant, Mr. Steven Simicich asked to hold 1840 Richmond Terrace until the June Meeting which was on the agenda for tonight.

### **2. CB1 motion proposed by Transportation Committee**

"That a letter of support for Councilman Ydanis Rodriguez's Int. No. 857, 'A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the creation of a citywide residential parking permit system', should be sent to Rodriguez and to the SI Councilmembers Rose, Matteo, and Borelli."

The Bill is a simple measure to authorize the establishment of a citywide residential parking permit system, e.g., the authority to designate "local residents only" parking permits in neighborhoods as needed.

Argument: Out of region parkers is an endemic and increasing problem throughout our district due to, e.g., commuters, construction, destination events, tourists, etc.

### **3. Express Bus redesign**

The MTA's plan to speed up SI's express buses completed Open Houses in SI and a full city-wide public hearing in April.

The MTA proposes to make a presentation to the full board in June. By this time the actual schedules will presumably have been completed for the revised routes.

### **5. Dockless bike share in SI**

"12 companies submit plans for dockless bike share coming to Staten Island", in the *Advance* April 18. The *Advance's* Tom Wroblewski greeted this with "Dockless bike share: Litter waiting to happen? (commentary)" (April 20).

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Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm.

**PRESENTATION**

At issue: Temporary out-patient counseling services at 1268 Forest Avenue, Westerleigh.

Luke Nasta, Executive Director, Camelot of Staten Island, Inc:

LN: The facility at 263 Port Richmond Avenue has been in place since 1973; Camelot received a grant from NY State in response to opioid epidemic to demolish and erect a new 35-bed residential treatment center, including out-patient counseling. Construction is going out to bid, projected completion will be in 2020. 1268 Forest Avenue is to be used for out-patient counseling, leased with a "quit claim" freeing Camelot from the lease as soon as construction is completed at Port Richmond site.

Q: can Camelot stay? Lease terms?

LN: There is a quit-claim. Camelot has "right of first refusal" if the owner decides to sell.

Q: so Camelot can stay there forever?

Q: no one was notified [neighborhood residents present litany of actual and potential grievances, ranging from lack of notification to un-monitored clients urinating on private property...]

LN: When we opened the Heberton Avenue residence we set up a 6-person Neighborhood Advisory Committee, which will hold monthly meetings...

Q: The Forest Avenue site is already open. We say people moving in beds...

LN: We have been open for one (1) month, serving about 60 people. No one lives there

Q: We had the right to be notified. We were denied the opportunity to give feedback...

LN: This is temporary...

Q: You have an option to buy. The letter said you'd be out by 2019, now you say 2020.

Q: Parking is inadequate.

Q: We already have the Salvation Army in the neighborhood, and homeless people...

Q: When is the Neighborhood Advisory Committee meeting? We should not have to wait a month to deal with issues...

LN: Not scheduled yet; I will make sure it is. If there are problems, 24/7 calls may be made to Susan Bernstein at 718.412.3170, or 718.816.6589...

CHAIR McBeth: Offered his phone number; urged residents to join the Committee

Q: [castigation of Community Board for allowing this to happen]

LN: We will not be handing out medications. There will be no overnight services. We will only use the facility for counseling; operating hours Monday-Thursday 8am to 10pm, Fridays 8am to 5pm, and Saturdays 9am to 1pm.

Q: Parking is a problem. Lighting is bad in lot. How to monitor the clients?

LN: We'll look into adding a light. We have cameras in place.

Q: You are leaving at the end of your lease?

LN: Yes.

Q: Do you support legalizing marijuana?

LN: No.

Q: Concerns about loitering, vandalism.
