Port Security New York Container Terminal, Bayonne Bridge, Goethals Bridge

Representatives from the Port Authority and the United States Coast Guard explained in detail the procedures and policies regarding security, emergency response and the measures that are taken to protect our Ports and Bridges.

The Reps. explained that they are constantly meeting/communicating with Fed. State & Local Law enforcement agencies regarding any possible threats that might impact the Harbor, Bridges and Ports. There were several questions that were raised by Committee members and the public that were thoroughly explained by both the PANYNJ & the Coast Guard.

Some of the things that the Reps. mentioned were: Ships need a 96 hour arrival notification before entering our port. 100% of the cargo being off loaded @ the ports is being screened for radiation.

Art Cappabianca mentioned to the Coast Guard the needs to monitor the water, both @ the surface and below, for potential dangers. The Coast Guard explained that they are working with the US Navy to start "sweeping" the harbor starting in mid to late April.

The PANYNJ & Coast Guard explained that our Port is the most assessed port in the Country. That means that the necessary resources are being utilized for keeping it running smoothly and more importantly- safe.

The Port of NY/NJ supports approximately 290,000 jobs in the Metropolitan area.

There was a motion to adjourn. It was accepted. Meeting was adjourned at 8:10pm.
