Chairwoman Remauro thanked Community Board #1's Santa aka Ken Tirado and Board Members for the generosity of gifts for the children at RUMC Pediatric Ward.

Santa Tirado thanked all of the Members for their gifts, thankfully there were not many children in the hospital this year and through the generosity of the numerous gifts that were received the additional gives were distributed to the children at the Family Life Center in Stapleton.

Chairwoman Remauro read the guest list of Elected Official Representatives, and Community Affairs Officers' of the 120th Pct.

PUBLIC SESSION

Ms. Ann Clinton on behalf of Assemblywoman Janelle-Hyer Spencer asked members to let Governor Patterson know that natural gas drilling poses too great a risk to our health and safety by calling 518-474-8390.

In September, the State's Environmental Agency released a review that would allow for natural gas drilling near the watershed through a process called hydro fracturing, which uses toxic chemicals that have contaminated drinking water in other parts of the county. Assemblywoman Hyer-Spencer is pushing for a State Law (A.8748) that would ban natural gas drilling within five miles of the city's watershed.

Ms. Clinton further urged everyone to sign on the Assemblywoman's on-line petition on the Assemblywoman's website for the MTA's proposed cuts to Staten Island's already limited public transportation services. The agency released a budget that would reduce bus service on the S42, S54, S57, S60 and S66 lines, cut the Access-A-Ride program for the elderly and disabled, and eliminate free Metro cards for New York City students. Assemblywoman Hyer-Spencer is leading a petition drive calling for the agency to cut the lofty salary and benefits of its own management before cutting our transportation services.

A flyer was left in the back of the room with information of e-mails and phone numbers of Governor Patterson, Speaker Quinn, the MTA and other representatives.

Ms. Heather Mast spoke of an initiative "Colleges for Change" the program is geared toward young adults to reduce outdoor smoking in parks, and outdoor areas. An informational packet was left with additional information.

Ms. Marcia St. Juste Youth Minster spoke of the Diamond's Banquet, registration deadline is January 23, 2010. Girls ages 8-12 can participate in a 10-hour community service project;

fashion show; girls just wanna have fun as well as an opportunity to win a grand prize at the Diamond Banquet. Girls ages 13-18 can participate in the rites of passage program; faith based workshops; vocational/academic goal setting and community services, the program concludes with a formal ball.
