Presentation by the NYC EDC on the NYC Ferry: Citywide Ferry Service Expansion, in particular the 2020 expansion to a St. George - Manhattan West Side route, the State Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS).

The new ferry will dock at a no-steps floating dock (a standard design with a modest weather-shelter) at the foot of (Staten Island) Wall St.

Adverse environmental impacts

- a. The only 'significant adverse impact' noted in the SEIS will be extra rush hour congestion at Richmond Terrace and Wall St., which can be 'fully mitigated ... through a three-second signal timing shift'.
- b. Concerns were raised at the meeting about extra parking.

Response: No extra parking demand is anticipated assuming that most trips on the new ferry will be cannibalized from trips on the existing Staten Island Ferry.


c. Concerns were raised at the meeting about poor handicapped accessibility to the main multi-modal Ferry / Train / Bus / Pedestrian / Cycle / Pick-up-Drop-off Terminal.


Response: Technically the handicapped access requirement is satisfied in that there is no-steps access between the ferry deck and the sidewalk at the foot of Wall St.

But that does not enable access to the existing Terminal

Problems include:

- i. The foot of Wall St. is a narrow turn-around loop and was not designed for Pick-up-Drop-off.
- ii. The former handicapped ramp access between the Terminal and the foot of Wall St. has been demolished.
- iii. The proposed handicapped access between the Terminal and the foot of Wall St. (an elevator) has not been completed.
