<u>FIRST VICE-CHAIRMAN, ANTHONY COSENTINO</u> – The Budget Public Hearing minutes are in the packet with the excel spread sheet of Budget requests.

Motion made and seconded to approve the FY 2013 budget requests as presented with the following changes and additions: Bollards at the end of Richmond Terrace and Alaska Street Moving of the Sanitation District 1 Garage should be changed to

65,000 and Fund Cultural Institutions with budgets under 249,999 should be 24, 999.

Roll call vote taken. Vote passed unanimously.

Chairwoman Remauro commended Mr. Cosentino for the fine job he did on the budget.

**SECOND VICE-CHAIRMAN, CHRISTOPHER ROONEY**- Mr. Rooney emphasized the importance of members going to their functional committee meetings. Many meetings were set up prior to the Board Meeting to make it easier for members to attend and the committees still do not have quorums. Transporation issues are for the most part being handled in the respective area; the Rules Committee meets on an as needed basis.

CHAIRWOMAN, LETICIA REMAURO — Chairwoman Remauro thanked Second Vice-Chairman, Christopher Rooney and Third Vice-Chairman, Friday Ogbewele and all of the Chairpersons for gathering information for the Budget Public Hearing. One of the main budget requests that has been a budget request for many years, is to request HHC to allocate 5% of their budget to the two Staten Island Hospitals. Staten Island is the only borough that does not have a City Hospital. Chairwoman Remauro urged everyone to write a letter to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, Mr. Mark Page, requesting the above. We are asking all of the Staten Island Community Boards to join us in this request and will be presenting the request To Borough Board.

<u>DISTRICT MANAGER, JOSEPH CARROLL</u> - Mr. Carroll informed everyone that the Citizens Committee has beautification grants available for Civic and Block Associations. The Applications will be available on our website or you can go to: dot.nyc.org and click grants.

Mr. Carroll spoke of the street dedication for Mr. Daniel Rieu on Saturday, October 15, 2011, 1:00 P.M. at Lathrope and Bidwell Avenues. Mr. Rieu was a long time Board Member, he was one of the original "Green" Islanders, he used to work at the Empire State Building, rode his bike to work everyday from Westerleigh to the Ferry and over to the Empire State Building. He was a remarkable man, told amazing stories.

Ms. Fran Reali, Safari Reality, gave a presentation on Real Estate Short Sale which is a process which a lender agrees to receive a lower amount of an owed debt in exchange for the sale of the property to a third party. Borrows need to prove that they are experiencing a substantial financial hardship. The lender must be willing to accept the Short Sale proceeds as full settlement of debt. Short Sale will possibly help avoid foreclosure and

eviction, help minimize credit damage, counsel though the process, act as a liaison between the seller and the lender to ensure all parties work together toward a successful solution, provide relief during a difficult time and, market the property and find a buyer.

Ms. Marco asked questions of homes that are in foreclosure that are in disrepair and/or left abandoned, doors, windows open/broken etc. Ms. Marco has a home in her area, 881 Van Duzer Avenue, buildings keeps coming to seal the door and in a day or two vagrants must be going in because the door is wide open.

Mr. George Wonica Jr. responded, it is a frustrating process with these homes. Often times the real estates or banks are not in Staten Island, they have services to go out and cut the grass, and when they get to it they get to it. It is illegal to go into the home.
