Public Session:

Maria Conti, from Member of Assembly Michael Cusick's Office wanted to express the support of the Office of the Assembly and sent a letter which was shared with the Board.

Jermaine Williams New York City Department of Human Resources spoke of the Rental Assistance Agreement Program that is available to help with a one-time payment for their rent for people in need.

There is a location at CSI for anyone that needs help that was affected by the storm and suffered flood damage.

Frank Fontana spoke of Hurricane Ida; the Buildings Department went out to properties for damage and to ensure that there is no structural damage. DOB is waiving the fees for all permits if they need to fix the properties.

Mr. Fontana mentioned other programs which can be found on the DOB website.

Gene Guerre, Travis Avenue Civic Association spoke of DOT issues reinforcing left turn signal Victory Blvd. and Wild Avenue and the previous request to make Victory and Travis a maximum of 2 axl Road.

Carol Donovan Richmondtown Civic Association spoke of the damage from Hurricane Ida. She has concerns for building in Special Natural Area Districts. Carol Donovan requests that the climate crisis needs to be kept in mind when approving developments in that area.

Lilly Zafaronloo was representing Congress person Nicole Malliotakis – the Congresswoman was able to expedite over 600 passports and helped with 29 Citizenships as well as many other things.

Maci Bishop representing District Attorney Michael McMahon and was joined by Assistant District Attorney Maria Elena Plackasis. Submissions are being accepted for the 2022 Pet Calendar until October 1, 2021. There will be a Safe Halloween event in Veteran's Park on October 30, 2021 full of events. There will be a shred event on November 6th at the Friendship Club.

Presentations:

Matthew Roosa of the N.Y.C. Department of Transportation showed a power point presentation on the Neighborhood Loading Zone (NLZ) program. The NLZ reduces double parking on narrow residential streets by providing space at the curb for activities such as deliveries by commercial vehicles, taxi and car service pick-up and drop-off, and active loading and unloading of personal vehicles. Providing dedicated curb space for these activities reduces double parking as well as other unwanted standing behaviors, while creating a safer and more efficient environment for all road users. NLZs can help to reduce conflicts between trucks and cyclists, improve bus travel times, and better serve all the activities that occur on our city's streets.

Mr. Gene Guerra had a meeting in August with representatives of DOT asking that Victory Blvd. between Travis Avenue and Glen Street that it become a 2 axl road. In addition, if a loading zone can be placed on the south west corner of Wild Avenue and Victory Blvd. Rosanne Caruana, Commissioner of the Department of Transportation responded that this will be investigated.

Jeffrey Klein - Grand Union Holistic Solutions, a new privately-run, out-patient drug recovery center that focuses on holistically treating patients recovering from drug and alcohol addiction explained the program and received an overwhelming amount of support at the meeting. In addition, Chair Robert

P. Collegio mentioned that Community Board 2 has received numerous letters of support from Elected Officials and some residents.
