**Annadale Green Reconstruction Project** – Located at Jefferson Boulevard and Annadale Road. The budget is \$2.5M, funded by Councilman Joseph Borelli in fiscal year 2023. The project size is 13,500 sf.

Goals:

- Upgrade passive recreation amenities
- Facilitate passive use and community events
- Enhance access, circulation, and sight lines in the park
- Improve alignment of the WWII Monument

A Motion was put forth to accept the project as presented and was unanimously approved. A letter of support was requested and will be provided pending the vote at the General Board meeting.

- A question was raised regarding homeowners planting their own curb trees without Parks' assistance. Colleen will follow up.
- The city wants homeowners to replace their gas heating systems with electric heat and pumps. This is a very costly endeavor. Beginning January 2024, one-and two-family homes will not have any gas connections for heating or cooking.
- DOT's paint for the bus lanes is polluting our waterways with microplastics. They are painting the lanes every three years.
