Living Breakwaters Project Final Update – Background –

Living Breakwaters is an innovative coastal green infrastructure project designed to reduce or reverse erosion and damage from storm waves, improve the ecosystem health of Raritan Bay, and encourage stewardship of our nearshore waters and generally enhance people's experience of the shoreline of southern Staten Island. The project was initially developed by SCAPE Landscape Architecture for the Rebuild by Design (RBD) Competition, a design competition held by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to seek cutting edge ideas for coastal resilience in the wake of Hurricane Sandy. The project is being implemented by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery and is funded by HUD through the Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding as well as with funds from New York State.

The project is almost complete. Five of the eight breakwaters are fully complete. Three of the eight are substantially complete. The Shoreline Restoration was completed in the spring and is doing well. Site Observations have been performed regularly. Marine life has been observed. The Project Close-out will take place in November and December. The Community event took place on September 28, 2024.
