FILE NAMING CONVENTION

Analyses prepared by representatives and submitted electronically to the Tax Commission for review by hearing officers must comply with the following file naming convention:

Boro-Block-Lot-AYR

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Where:
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"-A" identifies the document as an analysis, and

"YR" represents the last two digits of the submission year.

Example: Using the naming convention listed above, an analysis for the One Centre Street tax parcel would be named 1-121-1-A25.

<u>Details</u>

- Use only dashes as separators. NO slashes. Correct: 1-121-1-A25 Wrong: 1/121/1-A25
- Do *not* use letters as borough indicators. Wrong: M-121-1 Boroughs should be represented with the appropriate digit below:
 - 1 -Manhattan
 - 2 -Bronx
 - 3 -Brooklyn
 - 4 -Queens
 - 5 -Staten Island
- Analyses pertaining to multiple properties (e.g. condominium units) must use the lowest lot of the lot range in the file name. Example: An analysis covers lots 1200-1205. The low lot of the condominium lot range is 1200 so the correct file name is: 1-1234-1200-A25
- Submission Year should be expressed as two digits. Therefore, a submission year of 2025 would be indicated by "25" in the YR position.
- If a submitted analysis seeks a reduction only in the back year, the submission year is still the current year.
- Do not submit documents unrelated to an analysis as part of the same file that indicates the submission is an analysis. For example, if you are submitting a TC159 for consideration by the hearing officer, it should be uploaded to Box.com separately from the analysis.
