- 4. A motion was made to approve the base station license application recommendations. The motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Item 5(a) on the Agenda, proposing amendments to the rules that will implement the Accessible E-Hail program. The rule was presented for a vote, and the rule passed by a unanimous vote.
- 6. Item 5(b) on the Agenda, proposing amendments to the rules that improve wheelchair accessible taxicab service by changing how the Taxi Improvement Fund is administered primarily by decreasing the maintenance payments to owners, changing the \$1 incentive payments to the drivers and increasing the grant payment for accessible vehicle Hack-up from \$14,000 to \$20,000. The rule was presented for a vote, and the rule passed by a unanimous vote.
- 7. Item 5(c) on the Agenda, proposing rules to reflect changes to state law following the passage of the COVID-19 Livery Vehicle Recovery Act. The rule was presented for a vote, and the rule passed by a unanimous vote.
- 8. Item 5(d) on the Agenda, a motion was made for expedited implementation of the COVID-19 Livery Vehicle Recovery Act rules, waiving the 30-day promulgation period. The motion was passed unanimously.
