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1	CHAIR DO: Good morning. I'm calling
2	this meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. I'm
3	David Do, commissioner of the Taxi and
4	Limousine Commission. I'm joined today by
5	Board of Commissioners Mitchell, Sorrentino,
6	Velazquez, Bader and Chan.
7	Happy Lunar New Year, everyone.
8	Wishing my fellow commissioners, our
9	licensees, and our TLC family, a prosperous
10	Year of the Wood Snake. Now, I'd like to
11	recognize Commissioner Chan, to give us
12	well-wishes.
13	Commissioner Chan.
14	COMMISSIONER CHAN: Thank you,
15	Commissioner. As many of you know, today is
16	Lunar New Year and it's the Year of the
17	Snake. To those of you celebrating the
18	holiday, I'd like to wish you and your loved
19	ones a happy, healthy, and prosperous new
20	year.
21	CHAIR DO: Thank you so much,
22	Commissioner.
23	Just a couple of announcements before
24	we begin. Continuing our busy hearing
25	schedule, I'd like to remind everyone that we

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1	have another public hearing next Wednesday.
2	This time, we will be focused on adjusting
3	driver minimum pay to account for increased
4	expenses and rule changes to deter future
5	driver access restrictions, better known as
6	lockouts. This affects thousands of
7	rideshare drivers and this administration's
8	ongoing commitment to make this city more
9	affordable.
10	I encourage people to sign up and
11	speak. You can do so at TLC rules@tlc.
12	nyc.gov or call (212)676-1135 by 5:00 p.m. on
13	February 5, 2025. You can also submit
14	written comments online at www.nyc.gov/nyc
15	rules. Public comments are integral to our
16	rule-making process. And I'd also like to
17	note that we've received two petitions for
18	rulemaking from our stakeholders. We are
19	very appreciative of those, and they include
20	valuable ideas. The Commission reviewed them
21	both, and ultimately decided the appropriate
22	action was to integrate those ideas into our
23	own proposal and move ahead next week, in
24	which we will be hearing it. So, we're
25	looking forward to hearing more thoughts on

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driver payrolls next week. Next, I have a brief update on the ongoing efforts by the State, meant to address decades old issues for the for-hire insurance market. I met with Superintendent Harris to discuss three bills that's put forward in the Governor's budget. Broadly, the bills are meant to increase coverage, dependability, get rates to more actuarially appropriate levels and allow for more options in the market. The superintendent expressed confidence and optimism that the bills will help stabilize and strengthen the market, and provide drivers with more choices for quality, dependable coverage. We'll be watching the development of those bills closely, and we appreciate the State's efforts to address these longstanding issues. Now onto our rulemaking. Today, we have three rule proposals to vote on. The

first requires new wait times for vehicles dispatched by high-volume for-hire services. This is to encourage accessible vehicle dispatchers and their bases to continually prioritizing and improving the quality of

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1	accessible vehicle service in New York City.
2	The new rule is that dispatchers serve at
3	least 90 percent of WAV request in
4	ten minutes or less. If adopted, the
5	evaluation period for the remainder of the
6	2025 calendar year would begin on April 1st.
7	Our second proposal implements Local
8	Laws 33 and 56 of 2024 by creating an
9	interior advertising provider license
10	applicable to for-hire vehicles. These rules
11	create a formal procedure for the licensing
12	and supervision of businesses that provide
13	approved electronic tablets and software for
14	interior advertising in for-hire vehicles,
15	including appropriate penalties for
16	violations of these rules. TLC will be able
17	to review required data provided by each
18	provider and examine the compensation
19	perceived by drivers, and also adjust the
20	rate of compensation as necessary.
21	Passengers will be able to tip drivers
22	through the tablet if the transaction is
23	processed through a TLC-licensed base with an
24	integrated application. After reviewing the
25	written comments and testimony from the

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1	January 9th hearing, we made the following
2	changes; one, we expand a certain tablet
3	functions for passengers, while limiting
4	certain tablet functions for drivers. We are
5	proposing less restrictive privacy and
6	geolocation standards in keeping with current
7	practices of the National Advertising
8	Institute. Some technical changes were made
9	to the insurance requirements as well.
10	Our third proposal amends our insurance
11	rules to better insure coverage for
12	TLC-licensed vehicles. It requires insurers
13	to be authorized to do business in New York
14	State by the superintendent of insurance, and
15	also includes comprehensive reporting
16	requirements aligned with New York State
17	Vehicle and Traffic Law, the New York State
18	DMV, and the New York State Department of
19	Financial Services.
20	TLC has made several changes to the
21	proposed rules following the written comments
22	and testimony at the public hearing on
23	December 11th. We've removed language that
24	insurance carriers be solvent and responsible
25	companies, instead focusing on the

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1	requirement that they be authorized to do
2	business in the state by the superintendent
3	of insurance. This will provide more
4	coverage flexibility for TLC vehicle owners
5	as carriers under the state level regulatory
6	review. And it removes the need for vehicle
7	owners to determine their carrier's financial
8	status.
9	We also deleted the policy holder name
10	and covered vehicle registration name
11	matching requirement as unnecessary.
12	New York State motor vehicle licensing
13	requirements already cover these issues.
14	We're also deleting the requirement for TLC
15	minimum coverage to be met through a single
16	primary policy, so long as the carrier is
17	authorized to do business in New York State.
18	Most importantly, the effective date for the
19	new regulations will be January 1, 2026.
20	This gives everyone sufficient notice to be
21	able to comply for next year's vehicle
22	license renewal.
23	I will now go the general counsel
24	Sherryl Eluto to take us through the agenda.
25	MS. ELUTO: Good morning,

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1	Commissioners.
2	The first item before you are the
3	minutes for the October 16, 2024, Commission
4	meeting. I will call a vote to adopt those
5	minutes.
6	All in favor of adopting the minutes,
7	raise your hand.
8	(Hands raised.)
9	MS. ELUTO: Thank you. The vote is
10	unanimous.
11	I will now call on Executive Director
12	of Application Processing, Antoinette
13	Jean-Louis, to present the base license
14	applications.
15	MS. JEAN-LOUIS: Good morning,
16	Commissioners. My name is Antoinette
17	Jean-Louis. I'm the executive director of
18	application processing for licensing.
19	We have 11 applications that are
20	waiting for your approval.
21	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, can we have
22	a vote on adopting the base license
23	recommendations? All in favor, please raise
24	your hands.
25	(Hands raised).

1 MS. ELUTO: And the vote passes 2 unanimously. 3 Thank you. 4 MS. JEAN-LOUIS: Thank you. 5 MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, we'll now turn to Item 5A on the agenda, the wait time 6 7 restrictions for FHV WAVs rule proposal. The 8 proposed rules were published in the City 9 Record on October 31, 2024, for public 10 comment. A public hearing was held by the 11 TLC on December 11th. On January 24, 2025, 12 the final version of the proposed rule was 13 posted on our website and circulated to the 14 Commissioners, along with the hearing 15 transcript and all written comments that were 16 received. 17 Commissioners, may we move for a vote? 18 All those in favor of the rules as amended, 19 please raise your hand. 20 (Hands raised). 21 MS. ELUTO: Thank you. The rule is 22 adopted unanimously. 23 We will now turn to Item 5B on the 24 The interior advertising provider aqenda. 25 licenses for TLC-licensed for-hire vehicles

1	rule proposal. The proposed rules were
2	published in the City Record on December 10th
3	for public comment. A public hearing was
4	held by the TLC on January 9th. And on
5	January 24th, the final version of the
б	proposed rule was posted on our website,
7	circulated to the Commissioners, along with
8	the hearing transcript and all written
9	comments.
10	Commissioners, may we move for a vote?
11	All those in favor
12	COMMISSIONER BADER: I'd like to speak
13	on that for a moment, please.
14	MS. ELUTO: Sure. I'll pause.
15	COMMISSIONER BADER: There was a lot of
16	testimony on this issue. I want everyone
17	here to be aware of the fact that we listened
18	and that we made many considerations. We
19	made sure that the individual drivers were
20	going to get a percentage of the revenue; in
21	this case, it's 25 percent. For passengers
22	who are concerned, we wanted to make sure
23	that the passenger had the option to turn off
24	this advertising, such that they would be
25	able to do whatever business they wanted to

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1	do while they're in the vehicle, and that is
2	also part of this. And we want to encourage
3	the riding public, as well as the drivers, to
4	inform us as soon as possible if any of these
5	new criteria that are a result of that
6	have come out as a result of this opportunity
7	for the individual companies to make money,
8	that they let us know if there is any
9	violation of any of these things because we
10	don't want anything to have a detrimental
11	impact on either the riding public or any
12	drivers.
13	Thank you.
14	CHAIR DO: Thank you.
15	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, may we move
16	for a vote?
17	All those in favor of adopting the
18	rules as amended, please raise your hand.
19	(Hands raised).
20	MS. ELUTO: Thank you. The rule
21	proposal passes unanimously.
22	Okay. We will now turn to Item 5C on
23	the agenda.
24	AUDIENCE MEMBER: Is a point of order
25	allowed?

1 MS. ELUTO: No. 2 AUDIENCE MEMBER: A procedural question 3 of issue? MS. ELUTO: 4 No. 5 We will now turn to Item 5C on the 6 agenda, the rule proposal amending the 7 insurance requirements for TLC-licensed 8 vehicles. The proposed rules were published 9 in the City Record on October 31st. A public 10 hearing was held by the TLC on December 11th. And on January 24th -- the final version of 11 12 those rules were posted on our website, 13 circulated to the Commissioners. 14 Any comments, Commissioners? 15 COMMISSIONER BADER: Once again, and 16 even more so, there were even more comments 17 relative to this issue. We were dealing with 18 an issue, as the Chair indicated, where the 19 State had kind of kicked this issue down the 20 road a lot many, many times. For the first time, the Financial Services Commission, 21 22 State of New York, decided they were going to 23 deal with this issue, and they have. One of 24 the -- as you notice in here, one of the 25 major changes is that this new rule is not to

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1	take effect for a year. One of the main
2	reasons for that is that in the very recently
3	released governor's budget and budget bills,
4	there are three proposed new bills that will
5	have a direct impact on the insurance
б	requirements for all taxis and for-hire
7	vehicles.
8	We are not sure at this time how that
9	will work out, whether or not those proposed
10	laws will pass, whether or not they'll pass
11	as originally proposed, or whether or not
12	they'll pass with amendments and changes, as
13	many happens many times when they go to the
14	legislature. But they are finally addressing
15	the seriousness of this issue, and we have
16	worked with them on this issue. The Chair
17	has worked with them on this issue very well.
18	We heard and there were many changes.
19	This rule changed probably more than
20	most other rules, since we've heard all the
21	testimonies from the interested parties and
22	we've adopted some into the rules. But we
23	also are in the situation whereby not having
24	this go into effect for another year. We'll
25	have opportunities, if need be, relative to

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1	what happens on the state level, to make any
2	adjustments that we feel will be appropriate.
3	And I thank the Chair for his
4	involvement directly with the State, so that
5	we had our input at that level, because they
6	certainly are not as familiar with the
7	industry here in the City of New York as we
8	are here.
9	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, may we move
10	for a vote?
11	All those in favor of adopting the
12	rules amended, please raise your hands.
13	(Hands raised).
14	MS. ELUTO: Okay. The rule proposal
15	passes unanimously.
16	Commissioner Do, I turn it back to you.
17	CHAIR DO: Thank you so much.
18	The time now is 10:15, and I call this
19	meeting to a close.
