2	MR. YASSKY: Good morning. Thank you
3	very much. I want to just first thank the
4	commissioners very much for being very
5	flexible with your schedules, and not just
6	scheduling this meeting on short notice but
7	the time change as well. For members of the
8	public in the industry who are here, I
9	appreciate your bearing with us.
10	We are going to make this as brief of a
11	meeting as we can because that is what we
12	promised, and we have a full meeting coming
13	up in July. So, I will skip a lengthy
14	chairman's report and move directly to
15	adoption of the minutes. Is there a motion?
16	MR. AROUT: Motion.
17	MR. GONZALES: Second it.
18	MR. YASSKY: All in favor?
19	THE COMMISSION: (In unison) Aye.
20	MR. YASSKY: A unanimous vote, the
21	minutes of the May 20, 2010 Commission
22	meeting are adopted.
23	We have a series of base applications
24	for approval. Can we do all of these
25	together, the new renewals, not the denials,

denial.

2	but all the acceptances together?
3	MR. AROUT: Right.
4	MR. YASSKY: So, I want to remove from
5	the list, there is one renewal and relocation
6	application for Bliss 48, Inc., that's
7	B01103. I know that there were not materials
8	for that included in the materials circulated
9	to the commissioners, so we will withdraw
10	that from consideration today and defer that
11	to the next meeting, but for the remainder of
12	the approvals, the new and renewals indicated
13	in the materials, is there a motion to
14	approve those?
15	MR. AROUT: Motion to approve.
16	MR. GONZALES: Second.
17	MS. STEELE-RADWAY: All 26?
18	MR. YASSKY: All 26. So, there is a
19	motion. All in favor?
20	THE COMMISSION: (In unison) Aye.
21	MR. YASSKY: So, by unanimous vote,
22	there are 26 new and renewal base
23	applications approved.
24	There are also two being recommended for

3	addition so that they can submit the
4	outstanding items.
5	MR. YASSKY: So, are we recommending
6	MS. STEELE-RADWAY: We are recommending
7	for denial another additional thirty days.
8	MR. YASSKY: Is there a motion to accept
9	that recommendation and deny those
10	applications?
11	MR. AROUT: So move.
12	MR. GONZALES: Second.
13	MR. YASSKY: All in favor?
14	THE COMMISSION: (In unison) Aye.
15	MR. YASSKY: A unanimous vote. Thank
16	you, Georgia. Those applications are denied.
17	Now, the main item of business today is
18	a proposal for a group ride stand for
19	medallion taxicabs on York Avenue on
20	Manhattan. The presentation for that
21	proposal will be by Emily Gallo.
22	MS. GALLI: Good morning. Beginning on
23	June 27th, the MTA is going to discontinue
24	the X90 express bus service that travels
25	between the Upper East Side and the Financial

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2	District. The X90 serves approximately 400
3	passengers each morning and makes stops every
4	few blocks along York Avenue from 92nd Street
5	to East 67th Street, as you can see on this
6	map. The price is approximately 4.50 to 5.50
7	per passenger depending on the type of fair
8	media that they purchase.
9	To offer an alternative to offer to
10	passengers who are affected by this service
11	cut, we are proposing to pilot a taxi group
12	ride stand in the area. In choosing the
13	location, we had several criteria. We wanted
L 4	the stand to be placed in an area that would
15	reach the most passengers of the X90 without
16	being too close to the existing taxi stand at
17	East 79th Street and York Avenue.
18	We also wanted the stand to be
19	conveniently located near an entry to the FDR
20	Drive South, so that the drivers could take
21	the most express route to lower Manhattan.
22	And lastly, we wanted to find a location
23	that we could use without inconveniencing
24	neighbors by eliminating a minimal number of
25	parking spaces.

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2	So, TLC's staff traveled on the X90 for
3	two mornings to count the number of
4	passengers who boarded at each stop. Our
5	counts showed that the highest number of
6	pickups were located at East 79th Street
7	where a current taxi stand is located,
8	followed by East 82nd, East 74th, East 72nd,
9	and East 67th. Based on these observations,
10	we went to scout for a site located in the
11	upper 60s or lower 70s.
12	The location that we believe is ideal
13	for this group ride stand is located on the
14	northbound side of York Avenue located
15	mid-block between East 70th and East 71st
16	Street. This location is convenient for an
17	estimated 100-plus X90 passengers and could
18	appeal to those as far south as East 67th
19	Street. It's a location of an existing taxi
20	stand that is five parking spots in length,
21	which means that we do not need to eliminate
22	one parking spot, we could just add the
23	option to group ride from this location.
24	And finally, this area provides very
25	easy access to the FDR Drive South allowing

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2	drivers to make a simple right turn on East
3	73rd Street.
4	So, the stand will offer both group ride
5	and standard rides. For the group ride, the
6	fare will be \$6 per person, which is the same
7	fare as the 79th Street taxi stand. The
8	taxis will be expected to enter the FDR Drive
9	by the 73rd Street entrance, and drop-offs
10	can begin in Lower Manhattan along Pearl
11	Street Water Street and as far as the World
12	Financial Center.
13	As you can see from this map, we have
14	suggested a route for the drivers, but
15	depending on the unique destinations of their
16	passengers, they can make drop-offs as they
17	see fit. For example, if a driver were to
18	pick up three passengers who were all heading
19	to the World Financial Center, we would
20	expect them to travel along the FDR Drive
21	straight to the World Financial Center.
22	So, pending your approval, outreach will
23	begin immediately for the new group ride
24	stand. We have created flyers for both
25	passengers and drivers to tell them about the

2	stand, both the new stand and the current
3	79th Street stand, and the flyers explain how
4	the group rides work. We are planning to
5	distribute these flyers to X90 passengers
6	later this week and distribute flyers to
7	drivers at the airports, to our facilities,
8	and to the fleets and garages to tell them
9	about this opportunity.
10	Does anyone have any questions?
11	MS. WEINSHALL: I don't have a question,
12	I just have an observation. As I discussed
13	with the Chairman, I travel to work that
14	route every morning, something to be aware
15	of, and I think you are going to have to work
16	with the police department, there is a lot of
17	trucks that double-park because of the
18	hospitals, and they also park in the taxi
19	lane. So, the only thing that I would say is
20	that, it's already very difficult for a car
21	to drive, and you just may want to monitor
22	where the trucks are double-parking or
23	parking in the taxi lane so that cabs can
24	actually pull in and pull in passengers
25	there.

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2	MR. YASSKY: Understood, and we
3	certainly will work with the precinct and our
4	own enforcement edition. The hospital, I
5	looked up the location myself, and as you
6	say, you know, the presence of a hospital
7	there means that there's a lot of traffic,
8	and sometimes people are coming out from the
9	curb. So, yes, that's something to be aware
10	of.
11	MS. WEINSHALL: And it's the worse time
12	for this type of stand, because it's early in
13	the morning that they're making the
14	deliveries to the hospital. So, you just
15	sort of have to be aware of that.
16	MR. AROUT: Emily, I just want to say
17	thank you very much for emailing. This was
18	great. You did a great job, it wasn't easy
19	putting together, but thank you very much. I
20	can understand it.
21	MS. GALLO: Thank you.
22	MR. YASSKY: Any further questions?
23	(No response)
24	MR. YASSKY: On that note, before we
25	vote, I'll say that I want to thank the TLC

2	staff, Ms. Gallo, and the entire staff who
3	worked on this. They did a terrific job very
4	speedily. You know, to deal with this loss
5	of service, we wanted to react with
6	appropriate quickness, and the staff went
7	above and beyond to do that and I just want
8	to thank them for that and for the quality of
9	the product. I'm very optimistic about this
10	being of use to some of the affected
11	commuters.
12	We are going to be calling on the staff
13	to do that even more in the coming weeks and
14	I suppose months, with everything on the
15	agenda, but in particular as a kind of
16	follow-up to this.
17	The Mayor, later this morning, will be
18	making an announcement and I don't want
19	to indeed, I could not preempt that, but I
20	noticed it is described on his public
21	schedule as "Announces new group ride van
22	service for commuters affected by MTA bus
23	cuts," an announcement at 10:30 for anyone
24	who wants to join at Melbourne Avenue and
25	150th Street in the Borough of Queens.

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2	You know, what the Mayor will do is ask
3	us commissioners to do what we have done here
4	in responding to the need for service to help
5	some of the commuters affected by MTA cuts
6	elsewhere in the City. It is kind of easiest
7	in Manhattan because our rules fit well with
8	the type of service needed in Manhattan.
9	Outside, it is a little more difficult and
10	will require some work because we have to of
11	course respect our fundamental policy
12	commitment that street service is provided by
13	13,237 medallion taxis, and that has worked
14	very well to ensure a high level, a
15	consistently high level of service to New
16	Yorkers and visitors. So, we have to use our
17	creativity and our energy to make sure that
18	we do what we need to do and should do to
19	help get people to work and around a little
20	bit faster where the MTA is unfortunately
21	being forced to cut back, and yet but working
22	within our framework.
23	So, that's the challenge for us. We've
24	been asked to do this, we will be asked to do
25	this in a really expedited time frame So

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2	the staff here will be working very hard.
3	Commissioners, I will be communicating with
4	you as these ideas evolve. But certainly the
5	expectation is that we will bring you a
6	presentation at the next Commission meeting
7	for some type of service outside of Manhattan
8	to deal with this. So, I just want you to be
9	on alert for that, and again, I will
10	communicate with each of you and work with
11	you as the thoughts evolve.
12	So, with that, is there a motion to
13	approve the York Avenue Taxi Group Ride
14	Stand?
15	MR. AROUT: Move.
16	MR. GONZALES: Second.
17	MR. AROUT: Mr. Chairman, do you have
18	the date for July?
19	MR. YASSKY: I believe it is July 15th.
20	Feel free to correct me. Yes, I see one head
21	nodding.
22	MS. WEINSHALL: Is that a Friday?
23	MR. YASSKY: I would be surprised. I'm
24	guessing that's a Thursday. Yes, I see

25 another head nodding. So, I believe that's a

3	MR. AROUT: Thank you.
4	MR. YASSKY: Again we'll confirm with
5	each of your offices. I believe we sent that
6	date out earlier, but we'll confirm with each
7	of your offices.
8	The motion has been made. It's been
9	seconded, but the kind of tension is building
10	appropriately, I was just waiting for the
11	drum roll but I see our musical accompaniment
12	is on leave. So, all in favor, say aye.
13	THE COMMISSION: (In unison) Aye.
14	MR. YASSKY: Opposed?
15	(No response)
16	MR. YASSKY: Without objection, the
17	motion is approved. I will now entertain a
18	motion to adjourn.
19	MS. WEINSHALL: So move.
20	MR. YASSKY: Can I second that?
21	MR. FRASER: You can.
22	MR. YASSKY: Seconded.
23	All in favor?
24	THE COMMISSION: (In unison) Aye.
